This letter is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request submitted to the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (NGA) dated 27 February 2017, in which you requested: "copy of records, electronic or otherwise, of the AGENCY SECURITY CLASSIFICATION MANAGEMENT PROGRAM DATA SF-311 Forms filled out by your agency for the last three years."

After a careful review of the documents responsive to your request, National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (NGA) subject matter experts have determined that the documents may be released in part with some information being withheld pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(3). FOIA exemption (b)(3) applies to information exempt from disclosure by other Federal statutes. In this case, the Federal statute which prevents disclosure is 10 U.S.C. §424 which authorizes NGA to withhold the identity of its employees.

Appeals to this determination should be made in writing within 90 calendar days from the date of this letter. In the appeal, you should reference FOIA case **2017-FOI-00047** detailing your reasons for reconsideration and include a copy of this letter. Your appeal should be mailed to the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency, FOIA/Privacy Act Program Office, Mail Stop N22-SISM, 7500 GEOINT Drive, Springfield, VA 22150.
