- 3. You must interview all pertinent witnesses, as well as collect and preserve all documentary evidence relating to the collision. Personnel suspected of committing an offense under reference (b) must be advised of their rights under Article 31 of reference (b) prior to questioning or as soon as it becomes apparent that an individual is suspected of an offense under reference (b). You must include either written statements or results of interviews for all witnesses contacted during this investigation.
- 4. Report your findings of fact, opinions, and recommendations for any appropriate corrective, administrative, or disciplinary
