

Dear Mr. Greenewald:

This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated September 10, 2009, that you submitted to the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) for information concerning correspondence between Senator John McCain and DIA. I apologize for the delay in responding to your request. DIA continues its efforts to eliminate the large backlog of pending FOIA requests. In order to properly respond, it was necessary to consult with another office within the agency.

A search of DIA's systems of records located three documents (3 pages) responsive to your request.

Upon review, I have determined that some portions of two documents (2 pages) must be withheld in part from disclosure pursuant to the FOIA. The withheld portions are exempt from release pursuant to Exemptions 3 and 6 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(3) and (b)(6). Exemption 3 applies to information specifically exempted by a statute establishing particular criteria for withholding. The applicable statute is 10 U.S.C. § 424. Statute 10 U.S.C. § 424 protects the identity of DIA employees, the organizational structure of the agency, and any function of DIA. Exemption 6 applies to information which if released would constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of other individuals.

Finally, I have determined that the remaining document (1 page) is appropriate for release in full.
