Synopsis: Recommend approval for the Phoenix Division building to be dedicated to the memory of Special Agent Robin L. Ahrens.

Reference:

Details: Special Agent-in-Charge, Phoenix Division, has requested the dedication of the Phoenix Division building to the memory of Special Agent (SA) Robin L. Ahrens.

SA Ahrens was killed in the line of duty on 10/04/1985, while participating with other Agents in the apprehension of fugitive Kenneth Don Barrett. The fugitive was sought for unlawful flight to avoid prosecution for armed robbery. The current location of the Phoenix Division is dedicated to SA Ahrens. A plaque is affixed to the outer wall of the leased building. The Phoenix Division would like to remove the plaque and rededicate to the memory of SA Ahrens at the new building (scheduled for completion in January 2012).

The Dedication Committee (formerly the Building Naming Committee) met to review the Phoenix Division's request. All members of the committee were present and the meeting was chaired by Associate Deputy Director Harrington. The committee concurs with and recommends approval of Phoenix Division's request for honoring SA Ahrens.

The committee also previously reviewed the subject of building naming and recommend that henceforth, in lieu of naming a building, an FBI organization be "dedicated to the individual

to be honored, or to the memory of the individual." If at some future time, there is more than one individual who the FBI desires to honor (such as if more than one SA were killed as a result of adversarial action from the same division), they could both be honored, whereas a building naming would entail renaming the entire building.

No lettering or plaques will be affixed to the exterior of buildings and the suggested locations for a dedication memorial is the entrance foyer, lobby, or atrium areas.

The current Building Naming Policy is in the process of revision to reflect the new guidance for dedications.

stand alone facility in New Windsor, NY. The NYO is estimating occupancy will occur in May/June 2015. In anticipation of the move to a new facility, the NYO is proposing to dedicate the building in honor of Special Agent (SA) Leonard W. Hatton, Jr., end of watch September 11, 2001.

The Building Naming Committee met on April 6, 2015 and recommends proceeding with the NYO's proposal in accordance with FBI Corporate Policy Directive CPD 0116D titled "FBI Policy for Naming GSA-Owned, GSA-Leased, and FBI Owned Buildings". The NYO obtained confirmation that the Hatton family supports the dedication of the HVRA. Accordingly, the NYO would like to move forward with a lobby plaque and ribbon cutting ceremony.

The new HVRA is a GSA-leased commercial facility in which the FBI is the sole tenant. It was a build-to-suit project, which means it was built for the specific needs of the FBI. In accordance with Section 8.3.1 which states "The proposed name must be of notable character and accomplishment befitting such an honor," the NYO submitted the following:

SA Hatton served six years in the United States Marine Corps (USMC) prior to entering on duty with the FBI in 1985 as a Special Agent. Prior to arriving in the NYO in 1991, he was posted in the New Orleans Field Office and the Alexandria, Louisiana, Resident Agency. While assigned to the NYO, he served on the FBI/NYPD Bank Robbery Joint Task Force (JTF-1), which was the first JTF in the FBI.

SA Hatton developed a reputation as an energetic and enthusiastic agent, who was an outstanding interviewer and source developer, an expert crime scene examiner, and who also became certified as a Special Agent Bomb Technician (SABT). SA Hatton was instrumental in mentoring new agents to develop as investigators.

SA Hatton was part of the team which processed the 1996 bombing of the El-Khobar Towers in Saudi Arabia, and the U.S. Embassies in Kenya and

Tanzania in 1998. SA Hatton also served as a volunteer fireman in his hometown of Ridgefield Park, NJ.

On September 11, 2001, SA Hatton was killed in the terrorist attack on the World Trade Center (WTC) in NY. SA Hatton was on his way to the Field Office when he saw smoke and fire coming from the WTC North Tower. In an act of selfless bravery and compassion which defined SA Hatton's character, he rushed to the scene to assist. While on the roof of the neighboring Marriott Hotel, SA Hatton reported the second jet airliner strike on the WTC South Tower. Due to falling debris, SA Hatton moved from the roof and joined the NYC Fire Department in evacuating occupants, SA Hatton was killed by falling debris of the WTC South Tower when the building collapsed.

In light of SA Hatton's heroic service to America, dedication to the FBI, and volunteerism to his community, he is a shining example of the FBI motto, Fidelity, Bravery, and Integrity, and is worthy of such recognition for his sacrifice.

FLSD has previously been in touch with GSA and with the lessor; both are supportive of this dedication. Upon final FBI approval of the committee's recommendation, FLSD will coordinate with NYO for the plaque and ribbon cutting ceremony.
