
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
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The National Council of Churches is asking you to join our efforts today, because the task is so great, the injustice so massive, that we simply cannot do it alone.

Dear Triend,

This is my son, Pedro, talking to his father, Leonard Crow Dog, in a Federal prison.

Prison was extremely difficult for Leonard. Not only was he moved 14 times in just four months, but solitary confinement damaged his health. Leonard lost more than 50 pounds during his confinement.

If he were a criminal I could not rightfully defend him --- even though he is my husband. But, his "crimes" were healing his people, protecting his family, and working to build his nation. For this, for these "crimes," he has received sentences totaling 26 years in prison!!!

Without the support of the National Council of Churches, there would be no hope at all. Please help them keep my husband from spending the rest of his life in prison.

There is even more here at stake than one man's freedom . . . and that is the future of my tribe . . . the future of my children's children. How can I possibly express to you in a brief letter the tragedies all Native Americans endure? The sorrow of senseless killings, sickness, umbelievable poverty, a scattered tribe . . . can you possibly understand our fate?

Please help today.

# 100-50819-1798 September 22, 1976 Dear I have received your letter of August 25th and apologize for the delay in responding to it; however, I was checking into allegations made in your enclosure from the National Council of Churches concerning Mr. Leonard Crow Dog. With regard to the commentary in the pamphlet, I would first say that in each of the instances mentioned Mr. Crow Dog was indicted on various charges by the appropriate authority and tried by a jury of his peers. I certainly do not feel the claims, as set out, are valid. Mr. Crow Dog was sentenced on August 5, 1975, to terms of three years and eight years imprisonment for conviction on charges stemming from the assault, impeding and robbing of Postal Inspectors at Wounded Knee during the Indian takeover in 1973. Imprisonment was suspended and the was placed on probation for a term of five years, and on May 3, 1976, the conviction was upheld in the Court of Appeals. Th June, 1976, he filed for reduction of sentence and this matter has not yet been resolved in the courts. The second incident mentioned in the pamphlet relates to Mr. Crow Dog's conviction in November, 1975, on charges that two Indian males were held against their will at the residence of Mr. Crow Dog on the Rosebud Reservation and that these two Indian males were badly beaten by a large group of individuals for a two-hour period. One of those beaten was hospitalized with a broken back, broken jaw and related injuries. For your information, Mr. Leonard Crow Dog has been the subject of rederal prosecution in three actions:

1. Mr. Crow Dog was sentenced, on August 5, 1975, to a term of three years' imprisonment following his conviction on charges that he had violated Title 18, United States Code (USQ), Sections 111 and 1114. On the same action, Mr. Crow Dog was sentenced to a term of imprisonment of eight years following his conviction on charges that he had violated Title 18, USC, Disgo ions 1153 and 2112. The above terms of imprisonment were suspended and Mr. Crow Dog was placed on probation for a term of Five years. On May 3, 1976, the Eighth Circuit Court of Appeals upheld the verdict of conviction. On June 14, 1976, Mr. Crow Dog filed for reduction of sentence and this matter remains to be resolved in the courts. The records concerning Mr. Crow Dog's prosecution in these criminal proceedings are available in the United States District Court (USDC) records maintained in the Northern District of Iowa.

2. Mr. Crow Dog was indicted on charges that he had violated Title 18, USC, Section 1153 and South Dakota Criminal Law, Section 22-18-11. The indictment was dismissed by the USDC for the District of South Dakota on May 12, 1975, Additionally a superseding indictment alleging violation of the above-cited AD AM Statutes, was returned in another cristoll proceeding on April 25, AD W. 1975. On March 1, 1976, Mr. Crow Dog was sentenced to five Myears' imprisonment following his conviction under this criminal action, which sentence was suspended and the was placed on probation for a period of five years, agon this date, Mr. Crow Dog has not filed an appeal in this criminal proceeding. The records reports Concerning the above-cited Federal prosequations are available to you in the court records for USDG for the District of South Labour Dakota. 3. Mr. Crow Dog was tried in the USDC for the District of South Dakota on two counts of Assault With a Dangerous Weapon, Title 18, USC, Section 1153. On November 21, 1975, Mr. Crow Dog was found guilty on the above charge and was sentenced to five years imprisonment. Imposition of this sentence under Count III of the above indictment was set aside and Mr. Crow Dog was placed on probation for a term of five years to commence upon his release from Federal custody in connection with his conviction under Count I of the above indictment. On December 9, 1975, Mr. Crow Dog appealed this conviction under this criminal proceeding and, to date, this appeal has not been ruled upon by the Eighth Circuit Court of Appeals.

In connection with the above, records of the USDC and Circuit Court of Appeals are public documents which are available to any person for review. I wish that I could be more specific in responding to the allegations which have been made on behalf of Mr. Crow Dog. Federal officers are precluded from commenting directly on matters which are the subject of continuing litigation, but I would like to assure you that all actions taken by FBI Agents with respect to this Bureau's investigation and the United States Government's subsequent prosecution of Mr. Crow Dog were taken within the line of the FBI Agents' official duties and in a good faith effort to reasonably discharge their duties under law.

NOTE TO SAC, BUFFALO, AND ASAC, RAPID CITY: This pertains to the Crime on Indian Reservation cases and related matters involving Leonard Crow Dog, the traditional Sioux medicine man, in which Minneapolis-Rapid City is the Office of Origin. Enclosed are copies of a letter from and a pamphlet from the National Council of Churches, Division of Church and Society, New York, New York, which enclosed with his letter. Furnished Buffalo and Rapid City for information and record purposes.

wrote a letter ead dated Rugust 25, 1970, in Which he enclosed a pamphlet from the National Council of Churches, Division of Church-and Society, from the desk of Dean M. Relley, Executive for Religious and Civil Liberty. Summarized, this pamphlet alleges Leonard Crow Dog was the subject of continual harassment and trumped-up charges by the Pederal Government. Dean M. Kelley solicited financial support to obtain expert legal counsel which he stated Crow Dog needs to reverse his convictions. brief letter stated, "If the enclosed is false, the National Council of Churches shall so be told and possibly exposed as liars. If it be true, do you have any rebuttal to what appears gross injustice? Bufiles reflect we have had previous correspondence with on other matters. This matter was coordinated by SA John C. Gordon, General Government Crimes Unit, with SA Robert C. Blunt, Legal Counsel Division, on September 3, 1976.

The Privacy Act Unit has reviewed this letter and believes the information being released is consistent with disclosures made in similar instances under the Privacy Act. It is also their view the information can be released to the requested based on Department of Justice regulations which relate to the collection, storage, and dissemination of criminal history record information.

This matter was discussed with Deputy Assistant Attorney General Mary C. Lawton, Office of Legal Counsel, who advised that it was her view that it would be better not to provide the specific criminal court case number, but as a policy matter, advise the requester by using terminology such as the information is available from public records maintained in the various U. S.

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Mr. Cederserg. Mr. Director, the hour is getting late and I do not desire to prolong your time before our committee, but I would like to say that I realize, of necessity, a good portion of your testimony must be off the record; but if the average American citizen could sit on this side of the table and listen to your explanation of the subversive threats to our society, I am sure we would not have so many naive people in high places today.

Mr. Director, I just wonder if you can give any explanation as to why so many organizations that are basically sound and fiedicated to doing what is right-and I do not hesitate to name one of them, the National Council of Churches-why are some of the hierarchy of these organizations so naive to the threat posed by communism in this

country!

Mr. Hoover. Mr. Congressman, I think it is due to the fact they have not fully informed themselves as to what the facts are. Many people have the idea that communism is not a serious threat because the movement is numerically small in this country. Its numerical strength is one thing but we must judge it by its fanatical, dedicated, and disciplined membership. Most non-Communists are not disciplined, fanatical believers in the theory and practice of American democracy as are the Communists in communism. That is a reason why some of these people err in their thinking.

Such erroneous thinking often results in a great deal of harm, particularly in many organizations where the practice is followed of having the rank-and-file elect delegates to represent them at conventions without exhibiting a sufficient degree of alertness and interest to determine the beliefs of their chosen representatives. As a result, these representatives commit large groups of the rank-and-file to a course of action which in reality is contrary to their true feeling and beliefs. As I pointed out previously in my testimony, apathy also plays a strong part in creating a prevailing atmosphere of indifference to this

#### CHAPTER VIII

### Organizing for Mission

#### The Church and its Structure

The church is a community of faith and worship, living an ordered life of fellowship whose source and sustenance is the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ; a community of service whose field is the whole life of all men, since the redemptive work of God is for all men in their total being and relationships. It is an organism created by God which in order to further its mission utilizes various forms of organization.

The organizational structures of the united church shall reflect, in so far as can be, the church's continuity with the past—with the great company of faithful people who from apostolic times until now were witnesses to God's grace in Christ to all men. Thus, the united church accepts elements of polity previously identified as congregational, presbyterian, connectional, or episcopal, but it does not characterize its government by any one of these designations to the exclusion of the others. Because the church is commissioned by its Lord for mission in all the world, and wills to be faithful to its missionary task, its structures for carrying out the mission shall provide freedom for response to the Spirit of God. Therefore, the structures are open to renewal under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The structures of the church shall be determined by what the church is in its given nature and by what it undertakes to do in obedience to Christ; in this sense, structures shall be functionally determined. Hence, such structures shall, from time to time, be established, changed or eliminated as needs arise or conditions of life require. These structures shall be open for experiment, exploration, testing, and evaluation, with maximum emphasis upon local initiative and widespread participation.

#### A Resume of this Structure

As the uniting churches move from their current structural patterns to a new entity, several dilemmas are posed. In the search for an organizational pattern that would encourage flexibility within an orderly framework, decisions have been made on where we should begin as a united church. These decisions have been influenced by an overall concern for an emphasis on inclusiveness and mission at each of the areas of the church's organizational life: parish, district, region, nation, and beyond.

(1) The parish is a distinctive and fundamental focus of this Plan of

118 Each regular meeting of the National Assembly shall elect one of its members to be moderator of the National Assembly from the adjournment of that meeting until the adjournment of the next ensuing regular meeting of the National Assembly and until his successor is elected and takes office. Every member of the National Assembly, including ordained ministers and laymen (except the presiding bishop and members of his staff, and staff members of the national agencies), shall be eligible for this office. The moderator of the National Assembly shall be the presiding officer of the National Assembly and of the General Council. He shall be eligible for only one term.

On matters of faith and order the members of the National Assembly shall vote separately as (a) bishops, (b) presbyters and deacons, and (c) laymen. Such a proposal may be enacted only upon the concurrence of these three groups each by a majority wote. Any particular matter shall be designated a "matter of faith and order" upon the request of a majority of any one of these three groups.

120 (4) The National Assembly shall elect a General Council consisting of not fewer than five bishops, ten other ordained clergy, and thirty lay representatives to advise the presiding bishop of the church and to carry out the work of the National Assembly between its meetings. 121

(5) The program of the church at the national level shall be conducted by the National Assembly and the regions. The National Assembly shall coordinate the program throughout the churcha

(6) The National Assembly shall have power to

(a) create departments, agencies, and instrumentalities to perform needed functions at the national level, and elect the chief executives of each, on nomination through such processes as the National Assembly may develop,

(b) establish standards for the ordained ministry in consultation with the seminaries related to the united church and make provision for continuing theological education.

(c) elect a general council to carry out work for the Assembly between its meetings.

(d) own, operate, consolidate and strengthen, or dissolve (keeping in mind the compensatory principle) institutions of health, education, and welfare.

(e) organize, realign, and dissolve regions and national task groups after consultation with the regions and groups directly involved.

(f) adopt a budget for national work, setting fiscal standards and making provision for an equitable church-wide pension system,

(g) receive complaints and appeals from the regions and act with judicial authority.

(h) review and redirect the work of the regions and national task

(7) The General Council shall conduct the business affairs of the National Assembly. The National Assembly shall be incorporated. The General Council shall also be the trustees or directors of the National Assembly Corporation. Title to all church property of the National Assembly shall be held in the name of the National Assembly Corporation but it shall be held for the benefit of the whole church.

(8) The presiding bishop of the church shall be elected by the National Assembly. The term of office shall be for four years and he shall be eligible for re-election for another term of four years. When the end of a term arrives or when a vacancy otherwise occurs in the office of presiding bishop of the church, the General Council shall elect a nominating committee. This committee shall propose to the National Assembly only one candidate, who must already be a bishop and who, unless the incumbent be nominated, must be of a racial background different from that of the bishop who last held the office. Nominations of other candidates meeting the same requirements may be made from the floor. When a nominee is elected by the National Assembly by a majority vote of the ordained ministers and of the lay delegates voting separately, a call shall be presented to him. If no nominee is elected, the National Assembly may authorize the nominating committee elected by the General Council to proceed to seek another nominee or it may discharge that committee and itself elect a new nominating committée.

(9) The National Assembly shall continuously review the functional relationship between its structures and its mission. It shall establish, change, or eliminate structures as needs arise or conditions of life require.

134 (10) The National Assembly shall conduct as much of its program as possible through ecumenical action.

#### Church Courts

135 (1) The district, the region, and the National Assembly shall each elect a court composed of five ordained ministers and ten lay members.

(2) The church court of the district shall have original jurisdiction of all matters pertaining to the district, any of its parishes or any ministers or lay members of said parishes.

(3) The church court of the region shall have only appellate jurisdiction of matters decided in church courts of its districts. Its decisions shall be final except in matters that involve interpretation of this Plan of Union or the constitution of the united church.

(4) The church court of the National Assembly shall have original and appellate jurisdiction of matters decided in a church court of the region that involve interpretation of this Plan of Union or the constitution of the maited church. Its decisions shall be final.

f. The united church will welcome agreements with other churches in the world that would allow a reciprocal exchange and seating of delegates

with or without vote in each other's highest legislative bodies.

g. The Church of Christ Uniting will continue the efforts already begun by the various uniting churches to strengthen fraternal understanding, theological dialogue, and cooperation in mission with the Roman Catholic Church, the Orthodox churches, and various other Christian churches with which full communion has not yet been established.

## Relations with Conciliar Organizations

a. The united church reaffirms, active membership in and support for the World Council of Churches and the National Council of the Churches of Christ in the U.S.A. as current manifestations of the conciliar movement at these levels. Wherever applicable, the united church also will have membership in and give support for state and local councils or conferences of churches. In its responsibilities outside the United States, it will seek fraternal relationships through appropriate ecumenical channels with such regional bodies as the East Asia Christian Conference, the All-Africa Council of Churches, the Conference of European Churches, and other emerging conciliar structures in other parts of the world.

b. The united church will continue the participation and support given to forms of conciliar ecumenism not mentioned above that have been part of the life and practice of any of the uniting churches. It will seek to

encourage and to counsel new forms of conciliar expression

e. The united church will continue the participation and support of various consortia and coalitions that have been part of the life and practice of any of the uniting churches, subject to later review and corporate judgment by the new church.

#### Relations with World Communions and Confessional Bodies

The united church will maintain the present relationships, especially eucharistic fellowship, with world communions and confessional associations with which the uniting churches have been related. This participation, however, will reflect our new unity, and our representation to such associations will include the fullness of our new fellowship rather than the limitations of former denominational patterns.

## Relations with Jewish Communities

The united church gives thanks for its biblical roots in Israel and desires meaningful relationships with those who continue the heritage of Judaism in their faith and institutions. The united church will seek occu-

sions for theological dialogue, cooperation, and common action with the Jewish people.

#### Other Relations

Beyond the traditional household of God, the united church seeks to manifest openiess toward all groups and communities committed to human good. This commitment requires of us constant efforts toward mutual understanding and a readiness to cooperate in undertakings for the humanizing of life for all peoples everywhere.

a. The united church will seek greater knowledge of other world religions. It will be open to dialogue with them and to the application of shared interests and concerns. Common action may be undertaken where

compatible means and aims exist.

b. The united church will initiate opportunities for dialogue and action with representatives of political and economic movements of critical importance in the societies of men.

c. The united church will seek mutual knowledge and counsel with a variety of special disciplines important in the development of a human community that is to reflect the oneness of humanity. It will initiate and respond to approaches for dialogue, mutual correction, and common action with government agencies and permanent or ad hoc coalitions that give promise of movement toward goals compatible with those of the church.

## Continuing Ecumenical Education, Reform, and Action

The united church is committed to its own constant reform and the establishment of internal structures to continue the ecumenical education, experience, and action of its members. Creative experiments in theological education, liturgy, discipline, and polity that will involve and include the wider Christian community of scholarship and experience will be pursued for the sake of a growing wholeness in the church of Jesus Christ.

Dear Mr. Mitchell:

This letter is written in complaint with the way things are going on in your Department.

One thing I specifically object to is the belated revelation of intercepted telephone conversations allegedly made by the late Martin Luther King, Jr. If these revelations of his activities with another woman are true, they should have been revealed at the time. Over and above that, it is none of your business to be spying on other people's activities, be they proper or improper. For this selfacclaimed hero named J. Edgar Hoover to reveal these things about a man after he is dead and buried, is the mark of a dog in the manger rather than a dedicated public servant. The Lord advised us that the one without sin should cast the first stone. Let these operators in your Department, who feel they are so pure as to reveal things like this, examine their own consciences before they start to attack a man'who did more in his lifetime than any of them ever will, and is now passed away.

I am also annoyed at the arrogant infiltration of the National Council of Churches by Hoover's men for the Ostensible purpose of checking Communist thought in the clergy. It is none of your business to check up on the thought of anybody. I read that there had been an apology on the part of the FBI because of these actions. I would be happier if those responsible would be revealed and their punishments publicized. Notwithstanding the unwarranted personal attack on me in your letter of September 17th to the Attorney General which was referred to this Bureau and received on September 22nd, I can emphatically assure you the FBI has not made information regarding Martin Luther King available to any unauthorized source. In keeping with our responsibilities, we have, however, disseminated information concerning King on a high-level basis within the Executive Branch of the Government. Furthermore, this Bureau does not engage in blackmail activities and there is not one shred of truth in the allegation that Martin Luther King was blackmailed by the FBI.

Insofar as your comments regarding "the arrogant infiltration of the National Council of Churches by Hoover's men for the ostensible purpose of checking Communist thought in the clergy" are concerned, I can only presume you are referring to recent press articles quoting a leader of a religious organization that the FBI planted "agents" in his church. For your information, these claims are completely unfounded and erroneous and this Burcau has never issued an apology to anyone with respect to this as none is due.

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

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

I would deeply appreciate your time and thought and covet your reply. I shall be grateful for any help that you can afford me in this critical study.




