W.C.Sullivan of this Division participated in the interview. No synopsis is furnished 12 2 11 11 1 21 because the extreme seriousness of the charges made requires a full reading. **DETAILS:** The essence of General Trudeau's comments may be summed up as follows: (1) As a result of much study, thought and experience in Government, he has concluded that men of Fabian Socialist* views (and possibly some with Communist leanings) have penetrated certain policy-forming organs of our 1 Government to an alarming degree; (2) these men are to be found in very てみ sensitive positions or if not actually in such positions are so located as to be able to influence the thinking of (a) the Department of State; (b) Central M 3 Intelligence Agency; (c) Operations Coordinating Board; (d) United States Information Agency; (e) Intelligence Advisory Committee; (f) Bureau of Budget; (g) National Security Council; and (h) academic research units at 25 Harvard, Princeton, Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Johns Hopkins Universities as well as the Ford and Rockefeller Foundations who do vital research work for the Government; (3) the thinking, writing and 4 related activities of these men have resulted in a soft, vacillating, nondecisive and delayed-action program against Soviet Russia and world Communism which serves the purpose of the "peaceful-coexistence" strategy of the Communist conspiracy; (4) such a weak and false American policy program if not *See Addendum for identification. exposed and drastically changed may ultimately culminate in the complete downfall and annihilation of the United States by the forces of world Communism; and (5) THEREFORE, General Trudeau not being able any longer because of his transfer to Japan, to carry the fight against this creeping, subtle menace in the policy-forming area of our Government is advising the FBI of all he knows, turning over to it written documents in hope that the great loyalty, integrity and courage of the FBI will cause it to take some appropriate action on this grave and vital security issue.

General Trudeau also pointed out that the Central Intelligence Agency is developing far too much power in the high policy-forming areas of our Government. He indicated that if this development is allowed to continue, it may become (in view of the assumed penetration of CIA by Fabian Socialists) seriously inimical to the welfare of the United States.

General Trudeau explained that his recent difficulties (already known to the Director) which resulted in his being removed from his position as Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, and sent to Japan are directly due to the intense and concentrated opposition he has given to influential men in Government of Fabian Socialist views.

General Trudeau stated that his own remarks to the FBI on this matter are to be regarded in strict confidence as also are the names of two of his trusted men who helped develop the information he is furnishing to the FBI. These men are: (1) _______ of the Operations Coordinatin₁₀7C Board and (2) _______ of his own office (G-2). He said they b7D would be pleased to be of any assistance possible to the Bureau but would have to be approached with great discreetness.

General Trudeau left with the FBI some documents which show much study and effort on the part of himself and his assistants. They consist of (1) four detailed and elaborate charts setting forth names of individuals, organizations and committees of the Government; and (2) four pieces of mail: two not classified and two classified, one confidential and one top secret. The names of individuals are those who in the considered opinion of General Trudeau may be engaged in advancing Fabian Socialist ideas into the highest policy decisions of the United States Government. There are listed over 100 names. General Trudeau was advised we would give thought to the matter.

The FBI has no other choice, it seems, than to make the most careful study possible of the grave charges levied by General Trudeau. It will require an extensive file review of the persons named plus a comparative analysis of the policy examples and results furnished, with basic Fabian Socialist ideas.

It is of some interest to note at this point that about a couple of years ago the Bureau was concerned with a group of around 20 persons under Mr. Department of State, and with himself. Their backgrounds contained information relating to b6 b7C Communism which made them undesirable persons to receive the Bureau's highly confidential reports. Individually, some of this background could be explained but considered as a group concentrated in one area of the Department of State, namely, intelligence, it could not be explained away. The Bureau discussed the matter with former Under Secretary of State Donald Lourie and with Scott McLeod. Both seemed gravely disturbed and said they would do something about it, but did not. The matter was also discussed with Under Secretary of State Mr. Herbert Hoover, Jr., who, like the other two men, was gravely disturbed, but it is not known that he has done anything about it as yet.

The Central Research Section will make a thorough study of General Trudeau's charges. This study will consist of a complete file review plus an analysis of the policy examples and decisions furnished by General Trudeau which will be compared with the basic ideas and tactics of Fabian Socialism. However, this Section is already engaged in doing two important specials of considerable scope and it cannot devote full attention to General Trudeau's broad and intricate indictment until the specials are completed. Nevertheless, the Research Section will begin work at once on this new problem by taking steps to secure the full names and position identification of the persons listed by General Trudeau following which a file review will commence. General Trudeau's documents are being retained in the Research Section.

RECOMMENDATIONS: (1) That authority be given to conduct the file reviews and study as described above.



(2) That the final determination of action to be taken in this matter be made after the study has been completed and given full consideration by the Bureau.



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
The origin of organized Fabian Socialism is traceable to the establishment of the Fabian Society in London, England in 1884, largely as the result of the influence and teachings of Professor Thomas Davidson of New York, who was an occasional visitor in London. The name "Fabian" was derived from the name of Quintus FABIUS Maximus Verrucosus who became famous for his unique military tactics of avoiding direct battles and in resorting to deliberate procrastination and the using of delaying procedures during his defense of Rome against the attacks of Hannibal. Fabius kept his army always near Hannibal's but never attacked, harassing Hannibal continually, but never engaging in direct battle. The Romans grew tired of this and Fabius was removed from his command and supplanted by two generals who engaged Hannibal in open battle in 216 B. C. and were completely crushed by Hannibal. Later, by waiting for the right moment, Fabius took Tarentum from Hannibal, a signal victory. The aim of Fabian Socialism is to very skillfully permeate every segment of society with socialistic ideas, words, ideals, attitudes, tendencies and modes of thinking in order to gradually lay the foundation of a slow, steady, peaceful transformation of the social order from Capitalism to Socialism. The tactics used by Fabian Socialists are the military ones of Fabius but adapted and applied to human relations, namely, a policy of waiting, delay, indirection, avoidance of conflict, concessions, compromises, advances, zig-zagging, et cetera, all of which are to be done with great patience. The motto of the Fabians is: "To wait for the right moment patiently, like Fabius when he fought Hannibal; but when the right moment arrives one must strike energetically so as not to have waited in vain." The end of Fabian Socialism is the elimination of private ownership as an exclusive means of production and the substitution of state or social ownership of the means of production, hence, Socialism.

According to Angleton, CIA has definitely established that of G-2 has been disseminating derogatory information concerning CIA operations and employees to an individua<u>l out-</u> side of the United States Government. According to Angleton, motive in doing this was to attack CIA. CIA learned that very recently Mrs. an employee of G-2, contacted an individual whom Angleton described as a Democrat, a former Government official and a person with an outstanding reputation (he will be referred to as $Mr \cdot X$). Mrs. _____ advised Mr. I that an official in the Department of the Army was in possession of highly sensitive information concerning Communist penetrations in CIA and was interested in conferring with Mr. X. As a result of this preliminary contact, held a meeting with Mr. X at which time he produced documents and made statements charging that CIA was penetrated by Communists. Mr. X listened to the story and then called on a CIA official and related all of the facts. Angleton indicated that Mr. X has been a long-time friend of CIA. It is not known if the communication has been received at G-2 as yet.

In connection with the above-described development, your attention is directed to the following. General Trudeau called on the $b_{1,2}^{b_{1,2}}$ b7C Director in September, 1955, at which time he expressed his concern b7D about the Fabian Socialists in the United States Government. Trudeau made available some char<u>ts and indicated</u> that if the Bureau desired additional information, could be contacted. Information received by the Bureau indicated that General Trudeau had been handling the matter of "Fabian Socialists" in a very restricted manner and that all of the information in G-2 was being controlled by a very few individuals under the immediate supervision of Trudeau. was contacted and so far he has not furnished the Bureau any information.

On September 15, 1955, Charles J. Kersten, formerly a member of Congress and now attached to the staff of Nelson Rockefeller at the White House, called on the Director. Kersten stated to the Director that he wanted to discuss matters pertaining to the infiltration into the executive departments of individuals with Fabian Socialist philosophy. Kersten stated he had discussed this trend with General Trudeau and with ______ (this is Colonel ______ who is attached to the Operations Coordinating Board). Kersten stated that it was his understanding that General Trudeau had given the Director a set of charts and he indicated that he planned to discuss

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this matter with the Vice President. The Director informed Kersten that General Trudeau had shown some papers and charts and pointed out to Kersten that it was essential that there be further documentation with specific details to support any charts or memoranda, which might be prepared. It was emphasized to Kersten that authentication was important.

As a result of General Trudeau's conference with the Director in September, 1955, Inspector W. C. Sullivan has been giving attention to Trudeau's charges that the Government has been infiltrated with Fabian Socialists. In order to go any further. Mr. Sullivan has So been waiting to receive any available facts from far, this information has not been received. On October 6, 1955, Liaison Agent D. J. Sullivan advised that Kersten had talked to the Director about the subject of Fabian Socialists in Government which would indicate that G-2 was not holding this matter so closely as originally portrayed by General Trudeau. has worked very closely with him and Generalbe advised that Trudeau on this entire matter and Colonel has been in regular b7C contact with Kersten on the same subject. It was emphasized by b7D Sullivan that the Bureau wanted to specifically go on record that if there were any leaks the Bureau definitely was not involved.

The information set forth above clearly indicates that another feud is brewing between CIA and G-2. It is also indicated that G-2 has not handled the project of "Fabian Socialists" in a secure and prudent manner. If the above information is correct, it would indicate that _______ may be spreading his story about CIA and in so doing he has been caught by CIA. The nature of the intrigue which has developed makes it most important that the Bureau protect its position.

The details of this have not as yet been worked out. It is not known whether Senator Knowland will be a party to this. One of the purposes was to eventually apprise Herbert Hoover, Jr., of the situation. I learned from on a confidential basis that an individual by the name of has headed up this small group and the group was brought to Senator Knowland by who formerly was Knowland's and who is now an official in the Personnel Office of the State Department.

I asked the specific question as to whether this study group reflected information coming out of G-2. stated that it did not; that this was separate and apart from any G-2 studies.

Book for Molotov:

The Socialist Fallacy

By E. F. TOMPKINS

THE WORLD was startled by the Moscow news of a recently published confession by Soviet Foreign Minister Molotov.

The Kremlin's party line is that Russia, having achieved Socialism, is only now approaching Communism, when the state will "wither away." But Molotov did not know that last February. So he made an error. He implied that "a Socialist society has not yet been built in the U. S. S. R." by telling the Supreme Soviet that only "the foundations had been laid." This postponement of Communism, the Foreign Minister now concedes, was "theoretically and politically dangerous."

Radek's "Confession"

The apology recalled the "confession" by Karl Radek in Stalin's great blood purge, which was also "politically dangerous"—which was, in fact, Radek's swan song on his way to the executioner's dungeon.

Perhaps Molotov is too high a personage to be put aside. Yet if one of the last of the "Old Bolsheviks" does not know what Socialism is, or even if Russia has it, who would know? Does Molotov suffer from the ideological confusion that afflicts American intellectuals who are prone to Socialism without learning the nature of Socialism?

Such educated waifs need Max Eastman's book, "Reflections on the Failure of Socialism," published by The Devin-Adair Company, New York 10, N. Y. (\$2.75).

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Max Eastman belonged to the Socialist Party 40 years ago and, from 1912 to 1922, edited radical magazines. He studied Socialism—and Communism, its supposed apotheosis—intently, residing awhile in Russia. Today he advocates Capitalism. And, in his book, he charts his conversion by stages:

1—He believed in Socialism; 2—he believed in Soviet Russia and Socialism; 3—he believed in Lenin but not in Stalin; 4—he believed in Socialism but not in Lenin; 5—he no longer believed in Socialism but in the free-market economy.

At the end of his ideological research, gone was "the old wishful notion of a high-minded slide into Utopia."

The book contains numerous informed commentaries on Socialism in England and continental Europe. Regarding Russia, it says:

"So far as concerns the advance of human understanding, the Soviet Union is a gigantic roadblock, armed, fortified and defended by indoctrinated automatons made out of flesh, blood and brains in the robot-factories they call schools."

Handmaid of Communism

Noting his full realization after 1940 that the Socialist doctrine of "common ownership of the means of production was a delirious dream, a bubble," Max Eastman says:

"I sadly regret the precious twenty years I spent muddling and messing around with this idea which with enough mental clarity and moral force I might have seen through when I went to Russia in 1922."

Mr. Eastman regards Socialism as truly the handmaid of Communism. And, he warns:

"... In America as elsewhere it is the Socialist ideal, as surely as the Communist implementation of it, that is working against freedom."

The Socialists operate here, we are reminded, by abandoning their Socialist Party line and "adopting the Fabian policy of infiltration in others groups" a subversive technique which is being followed at present and which is causing genuine Republicans and Democrats both to worry.



Subsequent to this development, the Central Intelligence Agency made charges against the effect that he was maligning CIA. The Director has indicated we should not in any way become involved in a dispute between G-2 and CIA. (100-420468) b6 b7C b7D has never recontacted the Bureau to furnish the details he was supposed to furnish concerning the full identities of the individuals against whom charges have been tentatively made. In view of the conflict prevailing on this matter between G-2 and CIA, it is not believed desirable to recontact Further, it is not believed desirable to retain the information which General Trudeau furnished the Bureau without taking some action. Therefore, the Central Research Section will proceed to give this subject attention. The first step will be to secure the complete identities of the individuals against whom charges have been made. 

General Trudeau's indictment indicates that there are Fabian Socialists among these people who do research work and writing for the institutes which are engaged in preparing studies or documents for the Government. In view of this fact, it is, of course, necessary to first ascertain the names and addresses of the various research institutes which are engaged in this type of work for the U. S. Government. On doing this, it will next be necessary to secure the names of the members of the staffs through our field offices.

It is believed that the first step can be handled adequately by the Liaison Section, expressly, the securing of the complete names and addresses of all research institutes which have prepared or are now preparing documents or studies for U. S. Government agencies. Some examples which may be given offhand are the research institutes at Harvard University, Massachusetts. Institute of Technology, the Rand Corporation, etc.

5. **Proper dissemination has been made of identifiable derogatory information on the remaining individuals not investigated.**

6. Cases are pending on three subjects not now in Government employment. Cases on other individuals have been closed.

7. No attempt was made to verify present number of individuals still in Government because of the Director's instructions to remain out of G-2 and CIA feud. It was correctly assumed that inquiry would have aroused curiosity and questions in high policy-making Government circles.

Conclusions

1. FBI files do not contain any specific, concrete, and conclusive proof that the subjects are Fabian socialists as charged by General Trudeau.

2. FBI files do not contain any similar conclusive proof that these subjects have been and, in some instances, are influencing Government policy along Fabian socialist lines as charged by General Trudeau.

3. FBI files do show, however, that a considerable amount of "smoke" surrounds these subjects in that many have been charged by associates and acquaintances with the following:

a. Describing Chinese communists as being harmless "agrarian reformers" when they should have known that they were actually communists

b. Suppressing information unfavorable to communists and communism

c. Issuing slanted reports favoring communism

d. Minimizing the threat of Soviet Russia to peace and democracy

e. Manifesting thinking which coincides with socialist thinking in different instances

4. Others have been named by Louis Budenz, former official of the Communist Party, USA, as being communist or under communist discipline.

To sum up: While the evidence is not present to prove the validity of General Trudeau's charges, it must be admitted that the persons singled out by General Trudeau do not, in the main, have altogether clean, sound, and unquestionable security backgrounds. However, the FBI has investigated 94 of the 105 subjects on whom there is derogatory information. Proper dissemination of available derogatory information has also been made on those persons not investigated. Therefore, there appears to be no more to do at this time.


It is interesting to note that this study does show the FBI was already aware of these subjects and had information on them long before General Trudeau submitted their names.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

(1) That no dissemination be made of allegations by General Trudeau in accordance with Director's indication that Bureau should not in any way become involved in the dispute between G-2 and CIA.



DETAILS:

General Trudeau Material

General Trudeau furnished the Director with charts and memoranda purporting to substantiate charges that certain individuals in and out of Government were influencing the United States to take a soft policy against Soviet Russia and world communism. General Trudeau furnished the names of individuals, some allegedly with Fabian socialist leanings and possibly some with communist leanings, who, he stated, had penetrated certain policy-forming organs of our Government, including State Department, CIA, Operations Coordinating Board, Planning Control Group, and Planning Board, as well as academic research units at Harvard, Princeton, and Johns Hopkins Universities, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and the Ford and Rockefeller Foundations which do research work for the Government.

Fabian Socialism

Fabian socialism had its origin with the Fabian Society in England in 1884, largely as the result of influence and teaching of an American, Professor Thomas Davidson. The end of Fabian socialism is the elimination of private ownership as an exclusive means of production and the substitution of state or social ownership of the means of production; hence, socialism. The name Fabian was derived from a Roman general, Quintus Fabius Maximus Verrucosus, who became famous by his military tactics of avoiding direct battles, resorting to deliberate procrastination, and using delaying procedures

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during his defense of Rome against the attacks of Hannibal. The aim of Fabian socialism is to permeate every segment of society with socialistic ideas, words, attitudes, tendencies, and modes of thinking in order to gradually lay the foundation of a slow, steady, peaceful transformation of the social order from capitalism to socialism. The tactics of Fabian socialism include concessions, compromises, advances, avoidance of conflict, all of which are to be made with great patience.

CIA - G-2 Feud

General Trudeau was relieved in August, 1955, of his duties as Assistant Chief of Staff, U. S. Army, and as head of Army G-2, and was transferred to the Far East Command. General Trudeau's removal stemmed from charges by Allen Dulles, Director of CIA, who claimed that General Trudeau's dealings with top West German officials, including Dr. Heinz L. Krekler, West German Ambassador to the United States, and Chancellor Konrad Adenauer, during the latter's visit to the United States in 1955, were prejudicial to United States intelligence efforts. General Trudeau was reportedly critical to Ambassador Krekler and Chancellor Adenauer regarding the West German intelligence organization headed by General Reinhard von Gehlen which had been subsidized by CIA.

General Trudeau advised the Bureau on August 8, 1955, that in his visits with Ambassador Krekler and Chancellor Adenauer he had discussed nothing of an intelligence nature not already known. He admitted being at odds with CIA and stated that he believed CIA was attempting to gain complete control of the foreign intelligence field. According to an article by John O'Donnell, newspaper columnist, in the New York <u>Daily News</u>, September 2, 1955, page 2, General Trudeau was "fired" by President Eisenhower at the personal request of Allen Dulles, Director of CIA. According to O'Donnell, Dulles complained that Trudeau had talked with Chancellor Adenauer, without notifying CIA, in order to lessen Adenauer's confidence in the "CIA-bankrolled setup" in Germany operated by Reinhard Gehlen.

File Reviews

An analysis of the allegations of General Trudeau required very detailed and extensive file reviews on names submitted by General Trudeau. As there was no urgency, this has been done from time to time by the Central Research Section, other work permitting.

Results

1. Over 5, 500 references were reviewed in Bureau files on 122 names in charts and memoranda left with the Bureau by General Trudeau.

2. Three names were not identified in Bureau files, leaving a total of 119 names which were identified.

3. Identifiable derogatory information was found on 105 of the 119 individuals identified and is set forth in enclosure under separate captions.

4. Of the 105 individuals on whom identifiable derogatory information was found, 94 have been investigated by the Bureau under classifications of Atomic Energy Act, Voice of America, Loyalty of Government Employees, Security of Government Employees, CIA-Applicant, Special Inquiry-White House, Security Matter-C, Internal Security-R, and others. Results of investigations have been disseminated.

3. Derogatory information is set forth in enclosure regarding individuals who appear to be identical with names on General Trudeau's list. Some reportedly regarded the Chinese communists as "agrarian reformers." Several reportedly suppressed information unfavorable to communist activities in Europe during and after World War II while serving in Office of Strategic Services (OSS) and G-2. Others reportedly minimized the Soviet threat or slanted reports in State Department. Several identified by Whittaker Chambers

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



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
Central Intelligence Agency-Applicant, 1951 💥



According to Lerette, Trudeau has a fetish about security and intelligence work and cannot keep his fingers out of that area even though his present responsibility is that of Research and Development.

Lerette stated that regardless of Trudeau's above denial, confidentially advised him of his testimony before the above "Hill" group at Trudeau's direction. It was Lerette's opinion that at some opportune time, the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee will hold an open hearing with ______as a witness in order to "smear" the Kennedy Administration. Lerette continued that he is as "security minded" as anyone can be and having been in Army G2 activities most of his career, has been quite concerned about many of the individuals in high-level policy positions with questionable security backgrounds. However, he added that the "Fabian Socialists" issue has been "milked dry" and to again raise it publicly at this time can only do harm to the U.S., particularly in the field of international relations.

ACTION:

In view of the fact that General Trudeau denied that he was raising this issue and it is speculative only, plus the fact that the Bureau has disseminated the results of our investigations of the persons named, no further dissemination is being made of the above.






