The following article appeared in the "Minneapolis Morning Tribune" for Thursday, October 3, 1963:

"LETTER TO RICHFIELD BOY Negro Tells of Brother's Slaying

"One day last week, a letter from James
(Wee Will) Ware, 16-year-old Birmingham, Ala.;
Negro, arrived in Richfield.

"It was addressed to TOM OLSON, 6939 4th Av. S., a junior at Richfield High School. The pair became friends this summer when both were delegates at a national Hi-Y conference at St. Olaf College, Northfield, Minn.

"On Sept. 15, Wee Will was pedaling his bicycle along a street with his brother, Virgil, 13, sitting on the handlebars.

"Birmingham was tense, because of the bombing earlier of a Negro church, where four girls were killed: Denise McNair, 11; Carol Robertson, 14; Cynthia Wesley, 14, and Addie Mae Collins, 14.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

"On Docena Road, the two boys on the bicycle were approached by a red motorbike which was decorated with Confederate stickers and carrying two white youths. One of the youths pulled out a pistol and fired twice. Virgil Ware fell off the bike, fatally wounded.

"Two white youths, Lee Farley and Larry Joe Sims, both 16, have been charged with murder and bound over to a Birmingham Grand Jury that will convene Monday.

"Tom Olson read about the shooting in the papers and wrote his friend a consoling letter. Here is Wee Will's reply:

"'Hi, Tom,

"'Things are really going bad for me down here. Virgil, my brother's funeral will possibly be Sunday.

"'The newspapers don't give a complete rundown of what's going on around here. Our darling Governor has caused so much trouble, until I am about ready to leave this place. But I figure this is what he wants. All of the Negroes to leave Ala. (the nut).

"'THE LITTLE girl Denise McNair was my next door neighbor's niece. As you know she was one of the girls who was killed in the bombing of the 16th St. Bapt. Church.


"'I've been in school since the beginning of the semester but is quite hard to study with the fear that engulfs B'ham. We have a fire drill almost every morning because of a bomb threat.

"'All of the Negro businesses have closed up and near dark there isn't a Negro to be seen on the street. And could you blame them? The State Troopers sent here to protect us will ride along the street with their rebel flagged cars saying 'run nigger.'

"'It's quite difficult to write a cheerful letter under the circumstances but in spite of all I guess I still have a lot to be thankful for. Don't forget to come to my funeral when ever you read about it. (Smile, I think).

"'Love, Wee Will Ware."







BOTH OUTLEST HAVE APPROXIMATELY ONE HUNDRED REGULAR WHOLESALE CUSTOMERS PLUS THEY ALSO SELL TO ANYONE RETAIL. 

Dear Senator Robertson:

Last night (September 13) Washington television station WTOP broadcast a recording of some statements made in Baltimore by Governor Wallace of Alabama. In one statement the Governor charged that since 1947 there had been 47 bombings in Alabama of Negro homes and churches but that the Federal Bureau of Investigation, which had investigated every case, had failed to come with a single solution.

The Governor intimated that these bombings had very likely been committed by persons with pro-Negro sentiments who hoped through the "liberal" press and networks to arouse hatred against white persons in Alabama who are opposed to racial integration. He said that no Negroes had been killed and that personal injury and property damage had been slight. But that the integration forces, through the publicity given to the bombings, had succeeded in attracting much sympathy and money to their cause.

Governor Wallace also intimated that the F.B.I. in their investigations must have found evidence of this duplicity on the part of the pro-Negro forces. He said that such evidence if any has not been brought to light because of embarrassment it might bring to the United States Department of Justice and the Attorney General.

I feel that the charges made by Governor Wallace are serious ones which bring into question the integrity our system of justice on the Federal level. I therefore ask that the charges be looked into to determine their truth or falsity.

🖲 I have received the letter Colonel Karvey H. Hewitt wrote to you on September 14, 1963, with the copy of your reply to him of September 19th, and I do appreciate your bringing this matter, to my attention. Let me assure you at the outset that the implied charges against the FBI reported in Colonel Hewitt's letter have no basis in fact.

Both sides in the racial issue have used the FEI's name in recent months to gain support for their respective points of view. Goviously, neither side has spoken with any authority since their statements have dealt with cases on which no public announcement hap been made regarding the results of our investigations. supposition often is stated as fact, and the matter of legal jurisdiction frequently is ignored.

At the present time, different individuals are citing yarlous totals for the number of bombings which have occurred in Linboura. Some allege the FEI has investigated all of them; others Beclare we have taken little or no action. Our jurisdiction to investigate these bombings comes from the Civil Rights Act of 1860 which became effective on May 6, 1960. It is broad in scope, but the Repartment of Justice has stated that Congress clearly indicated there was no intention in the statute to usurp investigative and brosecutive authority in bombing matters from state and local no received authorities. #### Honorable A. Willis Robertson

The facts of each bombing incident have been presented immediately to the Department, and the FBI has been requested to investigate five bombing cases in Alabama, including the one on September 15th in which four children were killed. Due to the nature of the September 15th bombing, the FBI began an immediate investigation and advised the Department of the actions being taken. Although the FBI does not actively investigate all bombing cases, it does cooperate in every way possible with state and local authorities. The full facilities of the FBI Laboratory and Identification Division are available to render any assistance.

The FBI's actions in the civil rights field are governed by laws as they are in all fields. We cannot exceed our authority nor will we attempt to do so. If a Federal law within our jurisdiction is violated, FEI Agents will conduct a prompt, thorough and objective investigation. If no Federal law is involved, we will not--cannot--investigate.

In spite of these facts, we are accused of both exceeding and shirking our duties. Some of these charges stem from a lack of understanding, but many of them come from persons who have a personal interest and distort the truth to suit their own purposes.

Acting within the law, the FEI has recorded a number of accomplishments in the civil rights field. For example, FBI investigations have enabled the Department of Justice to file more than forty suits in five states to end racial discrimination in voting. FEI Agents solved the case involving the burning of a Greyhound bus transporting "Freedom Riders" through Alabama in 1961. Six persons have been convicted for their part in this crime. An FBI investigation in September, 1962, led to the arrest and conviction in state court of four persons for burning a Negro church in Terrell County, Georgia. FEI Agents also arrested Byron De La Beckwith, the man charged with the murder of Medgar Evers, the Mississippi leader of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.





Birmingham in its efforts to run down sources of dynamite has ascertained there are two manufacturers of dynamite in Alabama; E. I. DuPont at Watson and Hercules at McAdory. These two companies have one wholesale outlet in Birmingham apiece and these wholesale outlets have a total of 200 regular wholesale customers. They also sell retail. Due to the large mining operations in Birmingham the use of explosives is widespread and few accurate records are kept. Birmingham is continuing this project.

Additional interviews have been conducted in the neighborhood of the 16th Street Baptist Church without pertinent information being developed.

SAC Roy K. Moore at Birmingham advised at 7:35 p.m., that Charles Arnie Cagle was tried in local court today on charges of having in his possession dynamite. This trial resulted in his conviction following which he was fined \$100 plus costs and sentenced to six months in jail at hard labor. SAC Moore advised that the prosecution put on only two witnesses that being police officers.

Cagle and Robert E. Chambliss were arrested by the Alabama Highway Patrol (AHP) on 9-29-63, in connection with the Birmingham bombings on open charges. John Wesley Hall was also taken into custody 10-1-63, by the AHP. All three were charged on 10-1-63, with having in their possession an explosive, to wit, dynamite, without a permit as required by Section 451 of the General City Code of the city of Birmingham of 1944.

SAC Moore advised further that no date has been set as yet for the trial of Chambliss and Hall.





At 10:19 AM, on September 15, 1963, there was an explosion, generally believed to have been caused by ten or more sticks of dynamite, at the 16th Street Baptist Church, Birmingham, Alabama (Negro), taking the lives of four children, who were among approximately 100 - 125 people in attendance at Sunday School. Twenty or more persons were

injured. The church is located at the corner of 6th Avenue and 16th Street, North, near the downtown section of the city. The point of impact was outside the church, a brick building, on the 16th Street side under some concrete steps and against the wall. Damage to the church building was estimated to be \$30,000 - \$40,000 and undetermined amount of damage to surrounding buildings.
