Subject: PREPARING FOR THE 21ST CENTURY:
AN APPRAISAL OF U.S. INTELLIGENCE:

I would like to express my concern regarding one of the recommendations of the Aspin Commission. At Chapter 5, the Commission recommends that in order to strengthen the Director of Central Intelligence's (DCI) ability to manage the U.S. Intelligence Community he/she should be consulted on the appointment of the Assistant Director (AD) in charge of the FBI's National Security Division (NSD). The FBI objects to this recommendation in the strongest possible terms. We believe that this recommendation derives from a lack of understanding about the operations and structure of the FBI and, particularly, of the mission of the NSD.

Clearly, the suggestion that the DCI play a role in the selection of an FBI AD challenges the prerogative and authority of the FBI and the Department of Justice. Moreover, and fatally, it fails to recognize the law enforcement functions carried out by the NSD, including criminal cases relating to both international and domestic terrorism and espionage. As you know, the DCI is explicitly prohibited by law from having any "police, subpoena, or law enforcement powers or internal security functions." 50 U.S.C. § 403-3(d)(1). The DCI should not be in a

position to influence or determine crucial law enforcement appointments. The fact that the AD, NSD is also responsible for the FBI's counterintelligence mission does not overcome this hurdle.

While it is true that the DCI will have an interest in ensuring that the AD, NSD is a competent, experienced professional, it is no less true that the FBI Director has an interest in ensuring the same about the Chiefs of the DCI's Counter-Terrorism, Counterintelligence, and Crime and Narcotics Centers. Indeed, if consultation regarding the AD appointment is deemed appropriate, it is similarly appropriate for the FBI Director to be consulted on the appointment of these DCI Center officials, as well as the appointment of the Associate Deputy Director for Operations/Counterintelligence within the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA).

Moreover, because of the FBI's criminal investigative and counterintelligence responsibilities and the occasional need to investigate the activities of CIA personnel, permitting the DCI a role in the selection of the AD, NSD could be seen as creating a conflict of interest.

For these and other reasons, I do not believe the DCI should be consulted on the selection of an AD, NSD. I would appreciate the opportunity to discuss these matters with you in greater detail before any final action is taken on this recommendation.

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
