PURPOSE:

To recommend that in future CIA Applicant type investigations only 5 of the listed references and social acquaintances be interviewed.

BACKGROUND:

The Personal History Statement submitted by the Central Intelligence Agency has a list of 5 references and 5 social acquaintances. In the past reasonable efforts have been made to locate and interview all of these 10 listed individuals.

Supervisor Gordon Shanklin on November 7, 1950, contacted CIA, at which time it was pointed out that these investigations could be shortened by only interviewing 5 of the 10 listed individuals.

on November 8, 1950, contacted Supervisor Shanklin and advised that he desired to point out that the investigations conducted by the Bureau had uniformly been excellent, both from thoroughness and reporting. He stated that the completeness of these reports made it possible to properly evaluate the individual applicant and that of course, the more individuals interviewed, the more complete the report would be. However, he said that he was well aware of the fact that in the great majority of the instances the individuals listed by the applicant either as references or social acquaintances were personal friends and very seldom furnished derogatory information. He stated that he was agreeable to shortening the investigations by the Bureau only interviewing 5 of the listed 10 individuals. He pointed out that as in the past all 10 of these individuals names would be checked through their indices and in the event there was derogatory information concerning any of the listed individuals, he would continue to furnish this to the Bureau with the request that this particular individual be interviewed with the view toward determining the closeness of the association between the applicant and the listed individual.

CONCLUSIONS:

The above procedure will reduce the number of interviews necessary in CIA Applicant investigations by 5 in each case. At the time the investigation is ordered the Supervisor ordering the investigation can choose any 5 of the 10 listed individuals and by RECORDED - 96

The Executives Conference, with Messrs. Tolson, Laughlin for Belmont, Nease, Sizoo, Glavin, Parsons for Harbo, McGuire for Nichols, Clegg, Tracy, Ladd and Rosen in attendance, today considered the request of General Walter Bedell Smith, Director of CIA, as reflected in his letter to the Director of November 21, 1950, requesting the Bureau consider taking on an additional bases per month for a period of the next four months.

The Conference took cognizance of the fact that we are b3 handling cases per month at the present time: that the international situation, according to Smith, has put great pressure on CIA operating offices: that at the end of the four-month period Smith will be able to furnish a revised estimate in which he indicated the figure will be substantially reduced: that he is fully aware of the enormous work load of the FBI: that he would be willing to accept a longer time period for each investigation and that he would appreciate our views or. if the Director wished, he would be glad to discuss it further at the Director's convenience.

RECOMMENDATION

Under the circumstances, it was recommended that we take the additional cases per month for a specific period of four months. This will increase our present agreement to approximately a little over cases per month which we will have to handle for CIA. It was also recommended that a memorandum be addressed to General Smith advising him that we will accept these additional cases for the specific period and that we also stress the point that of course it will take a longer time period than is presently taken, in order to complete the additional cases, as a result of the additional work load which this puts on the Bureau. A proposed letter to General Smith, is attached. Respectfully.

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

BEING CONDUCTED FOR CIA Pursuant to instructions, Agent DeLoach discussed with General W. B. Smith of CIA this morning at 9:15 a.m. the numerous problems facing the Bureau during the present emergency. It was explained to the General that the FBI's volume of work had taken a sharp increase and that further increases were expected in the immediate future. The terrific pressure of Communist cases, espionage, and general national defense work was explained to the General. He was told that in view of all this, the Director felt it would be impossible to do justice to highly important interior security matters and at the same time continue applicant type investigations for several Government agencies. General Smith was advised that CIA was not the only agency affected by our decision. Central Intelle General Smith indicated that he was in complete sympathy with the Director and the FBI. stated he thoroughly understood the Bureau's role in the national emergency and that he personally felt we had more of a job on our hands than numerous sob3 called service agencies. He stated that he hoped that CIA in some manner might be able to help the Bureau in the event Mr. Hoover ever decided to call upon him. He also indicated that he perfectly understood the Bureau's position in desiring to cease applicant type investigations. He stated he sincerely hoped that Mr. Hoover would see fit to allow him the privilege of perhaps two requests per month, which he felt would be sufficient to handle the turnover of Assistant Directors or Communications Intelligence personnel within CIA. He added that he felt such highly sensitive personnel could not be trusted unless they were investigated by the FBI and that he would appreciate the Bureau's accepting this minimum request. CDD: lw Lw

It was indicated to General Smith that this matter would be taken under consideration and that he would be advised accordingly. He in turn replied that if the Bureau decided to conduct such investigations, he would see to it that they were conducted on a reimbursable basis of course.

The General was advised of our internal security jurisdiction, and it was indicated to him that in the event CIA established its own personnel investigative setup, in matters where subversive or internal security information was uncovered, such cases should be immediately referred to the FBI for further action. The General agreed with this viewpoint and stated that he would issue orders accordingly.

The above matters were also carefully explained

expressed his regrets that the Bureau was being forced to withdraw from the investigation of CIA applicants because of what he termed "the painstaking and thorough manner in which the FBI always handled matters." He stated he thoroughly understood the Bureau's position, however, and that he felt CIA could work out arrangements within its own setup as to the establishment of an investigative group.

OBSERVATIONS:

Due to the excellent attitude and spirit of cooperativeness as exhibited by General Smith and it is strongly recommended that we accept General Smith's request as to the investigation of two or three cases per month of highly placed and sensitive CIA personnel. Such a minimum of cases will not result in placing a burden of the Bureau by CIA, and it is felt that we will further General Smith's good faith and cooperation with the Bureau.



General Bolling advised Mr. Reynolds that his recent trip to the Pacific was most interesting and successful.

General Bolling commented that General MacArthur appeared in excellent physical health and as a matter of fact, looked younger than when General Bolling last saw him. He stated confidentially that General MacArthur did not appear quite as mentally agile as he did a year and a half ago, although General Bolling pointed out General MacArthur still is a brilliant man who has his finger on the centire Far East situation.

General Bolling stated that he visited Taegu in Korea and was impressed that the situation on the ground in Korea does not appear as bad as the reports received at Washington. General Bolling stated that little contact has been had with the North Korean forces in the last several days and he personally believes that the estimate of Chinese Communist forces in North Korea is grossly exaggerated. He pointed out that the terrain in Korea is most mountainous and that it is almost impossible to note troop movement on the ground from the air. He stated that it is entirely possible that the Chinese are withdrawing forces from North Korea for some unknown reason.



He stated that his request in this regard would not actually exceed two or three cases every six months and that he would deem it a definite privilege and favor if Mr. Hoover would see fit to afford him this "special-type" of request.

Agent DeLoach indicated to General Smith that his remarks would be made known to the Director. The General replied that he felt so seriously about this matter that he desired to personally contact the Director to advise him of his opinion.






