This prestige is reflected in favorable publicity and lack of the smith. criticism in the newspapers, an increased reliance on it by the other intelligence agencies, and the apparent close associations by General Smith with the President and other policymakers. The enhancement of CIA's standing appears in general to be due to the following factors: (1) General Bedell Smith has a personal prestige and standing far greater than prior heads of the agency. He is apparently close to the President, consults with the President on a weekly basis, and attends all the meetings of the Mational Security Council. He has close friendships with a number of Senators and Representatives, which he can use to advantage. General Smith is paid greater deference by the heads of the service agencies due to his military prestige and the fact that he outranks all of them. General Smith has a dynamic, aggressive personality, is intelligent, and commands respect. b3 For to them. However, the tendency seems to be at present to "dump" matters on CIA because CIA has the money to spend. In other words, the intelligence agencies seem to be more willing to let CIA take over projects and jurisdiction than they have been in the past.

General W. B. Smith, Director of CLA, has telephonical-

ly contacted Mr. DeLoach relative to the FBI preparing a summary regarding VPossible Ways in Which the Communist Party, USA Might and Attempt to Undermine Confidence in the United States Government.

General Smith indicated that he would appreciate the summary being as factual as possible, however, that he would additionally appreciate the summary containing methods by which attempts of this nature could be made. He indicated that he had no intention of disseminating this summary and that it was strictly for his own information and guidance. He stated that his request was strictly of a personal nature.

General Smith was advised that his request would be made known to the Director and that he would be contacted later as to a decision in this matter. It was additionally indicated that such a summary would entail a considerable amount of work in view of the broad generalities involved, however, that we would be glad to consider his request.

OBSERVATIONS:

It is believed that this particular request seems to be of a personal nature and reflects the interest of General Smith on a national level. It is also believed that he does not have in mind any attempt to disseminate this particular summary to other agencies as a product of CIA efforts.

Although the summary would undoubtedly involve a rather large research project, it is believed that it would be a worthy undertaking and very definitely a timely project.

It is further believed that this summary would not only prove valuable to General Smith in his administration of matters at CIA but that it would additionally prove valuable to other interested intelligence agencies, the White House, the Department of State, the RECORDED . 108

On 8-6-51, the Bureau was advised in a letter to the Director entitled "CIA CHECKS" that

of 22 days for searching FBI flimsies was unavoidable because CIA was furnishing another government agency with information relative to a Displaced Persons program thus causing a delay in FBI searches.

This is to advise that for the past 15 days, the length of time required by CIA for searching FBI flimsies has averaged approximately ten days, except the few cases involving extensive research and/or the writing of memoranda. These latter cases presently number nine; the most delinquent having been submitted to CIA on 9-4-51.

No reason has been advanced by CIA, for this improvement but he has advised CIA will try to maintain and improve this average as well as reduce the number of delinquent cases.

Any appreciable change in the length of time required by CIA to search FBI flimsies or in the situation generally, will be promptly reported to the Bureau.

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
