By letter dated July 6, 1957, the Legat, Tokyo, Japan, advised that SEATO plans to hold a Security Conference at Baguip Philippine Islands, late in November, 1957. Representatives from eight countries including the United States would be invited and certain of the representatives are to be designated to present reports concerning security problems in their respective countries. The Legat was advised on a confidential basis that the Director would be invited. It was further indicated to the Legat that CIA would be virtually controlling the conference. He pointed out that

Allen Dulles would also be invited to be a speaker. This conference will receive wide publicity.

On September 6, 1957, CIA, confidentially advised Agent Papich that he had been informed that CIA, in the very near future, planned to extend an invitation to the Director to appear as a speaker at the referenced conference. stated that if the Director did not desire to participate in the conference| was in a position to pass the word on to appropriate officials in CIA.

OBSERVATION:

It would not be desirable for the pitches or any Bureau representative to take part in a conference which could be used by CIA to capitalize on Bureau prestige and reputation.

Furthermore, we have been most careful not to get involved in SEATO matters bearing in mind that CIA and military agencies have been feuding obviously for the purpose of each trying to gain a dominating position.



"THE SECURITY IMPLICATIONS OF WORLD COMMUNISM IN 1957" ADDRESS OF RICHARD HELMS, ASSISTANT DIRECTOR, CIA IACP CONFERENCE, HONOLULU

Attached is the manuscript of an address delivered by RICHARD HELMS, CIA, at the general session on Monday morning, September 30. It is a survey of some of the aspects of Communism throughout the world. The manuscript itself contains a great deal of informative data concerning Communism, showing research and care in preparation. However, the speech appeared to be over the heads of most of the audience and Mr. HELMS' delivery was poor. His voice is soft and he stood too far from the microphone.

Mr. HELMS did not deviate from the text of his manuscript, and there is one reference to the FBI and to the Director:

"The Central Intelligence Agency enjoys close and effective cooperation with Mr. J. Edgar Hoover. It is not for me to speak of the accomplishments of the FBI and the various police forces in the United States, or of their very effective work in countering the Communist threat there. But today it is plain that the Communist Party of the United States is at its lowest ebb, chiefly because of the determined and professional manner in which the Communist conspiracy, in all its ramifications, is being exposed and prosecuted by the law enforcement agencies."

EXECUTIVE ORDER 10501 SUBJECT:

REGULATIONS RELATING TO DEFENSE INFORMATION

Central Intelligence Agency, on 10/24/57, advised Liaison Agent S. J. Papich that CIA requests that we classify Secret our replies to their communications in which our reply indicates permission for them to pass certain information to sources abroad. CIA considers the fact that they pass official data to sources abroad as classified Secret. "Sources abroad" in general refers to foreign intelligence services with which CIA exchanges data.

Our present rules specify classification of replies to other agencies based on classification of contents of reply and not on classification of incoming. This request from CIA specifies contents which it desires classified and change required in Manual for Bureau Supervisors. No instructions required for field offices since this not handled at field level.



of CIA has indicated to Agent Papich that his Agency is anticipating another series of attacks when Congress goes into session. This has already been brought out in some newspaper articles and, according to Angleton, CIA's sources close to Congress expect some "blasts" against CIA. In recent months, CIA has been criticized for not being on top of developments in the Middle East and from all indications, the Agency had not been in a position to alert the Government concerning Zhukov's dismissal. CIA has also received some criticism for not having alerted the Government concerning the Soviet earth satellite.

In connection with the foregoing, attention is directed to the enclosed article which appeared in the November 7, 1957, issue of the "Philadelphia Daily News." Robert Morris of the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee is quoted as calling for a "revamping of our intelligence network."



Revamping Of U. S. Spy **Network Urged** 

Robert Morris, chief counsel of the Senate Internal Security subcommittee, last night called for a "revamping of our intelligence net-

Morris told 100 person's attending a meeting sponsored by the Catholic Lecture Forum here that there is a serious underlying shortcoming in American intelligence abroad. The forum took place at the Philopatrian Literary Institute, 1923 Walnut St.

Morris stressed that the time element in case of a national disaster is more important now than ever before because of Russia's longrange missile program.

Morris urged er couragement of Communist defectors, the principal source of information concerning Russia. The Senate Internal Security subcommittee has been trying to alert authorities that Communists had access to vital communicstions lines which they could sabotage, Morris added.
