Speciaen Ql was ecomined chemically for the presence of poisons. Formaldehyde was detected in this speciaen. No other materials commonly considered poisonous were detected in speciaen Ql. Those substances tested for included cyanide, strychnine, barbiturates, chloral hydrate, arsenic, and others. The presence of formaldehyde in specimen Ql interfered with and prevented the testing of this specimen for alcohols.

HIGROSCOPIC:

<u>Meart:</u> Sections reveal hypertrophy of many muscle fibers and extensive patchy interstial fibresia.

Lunga: One block shows extensive consolidation with a surulent caudate in the bronchi and a fibrinocellular alveolar exudate, neutrophils predominating. The other block reveals scattered patches of alveoli containing proteined material and large monomuclear cells, some lader with homesiderin.

Liver: Cections reveal controlobular congestion and fine fat droplets in nearly all liver colls. Some peripertal areas show a mederate increase in fibrous tissue and a circuit inflammatory infiltrate.

Splcon: Unlpighian corpuscles are small. Remosiderin deposition is moderate.

<u>Kidney:</u> Cactions rowed autolysis, slight fibrous thickening of the intim of some arteries and fine fat droplets in the epitholium of many tubules, chiefly distal convoluted.

Feneress: Sections reveal some interlobular and focal intralobular fibrosis.

Drain, pituitary, prostato, and adrenal: No striking changes are seen.
