1. Subject arrived in Havana [unclear] [unclear] 1961, and requested an interview with L.C. Rodriguez. Interview was held on 2/24/61 with Rodriguez, La Villa. Six persons and groups were mentioned in this report. He is a member of the Executive Group of United Provinces-62. He was arrested on 23 April 1961 and released June 1961. He spent all this time in the Central Prison together with the following US nationals: John W. Bradley and Gino D'Amico, both professors of Villanova University; Bill Gibson, director of the Institute for the Americas; Harry Gentry, businessman, and another unidentified US national. The above mentioned individuals were still in La Cabaña when Subject left.

2. Subject stated that one Sergio Alonso Gilman, a radio operator who entered clandestinely into Cuba from the US to assist the underground, betrayed him to the G-2. Alonso informed Subject of the clandestine operations; one operation was named "SIBUR" and the other "W-2".

3. Subject stated that he is best qualified to facilitate contact with representatives of US agencies in order to render a full report of the conditions of some of the underground groups in Cuba. Subject is fluent in English and French and is personally acquainted with the principal Cuban Ambassadors in Havana. He also wishes to contact [unclear] which is his code name of a liaison agent for the underground to the US.

4. Subject was extremely nervous and excited and requested that he be allowed to rest for a few days before contact is established.
