<p>1. An RMT source [redacted] reported on 12 December 1961 that he had that day, by chance, met General R. GIRONA, a former colleague of Dr. Aurolio Sandoval Arango, at the New Orleans Airport. <i>2d/12 P/FY 303</i></p> <p>2. [redacted] stated that GIRONA told that he was returning that day from a trip to Mexico and Guatemala. In Mexico he had talked to President CHAVEZ and had found him to be jubilant, but, to the contrary, when he had talked to President VIDALAS in Guatemala he had found him extremely anxious to have CASTRO liquidated. VIDALAS had asked GIRONA about his visit to CHAVEZ, and when GIRONA expressed his opinion, VIDALAS said it was logical because CHAVEZ was extremely cowardly.</p> <p>3. According to [redacted] GIRONA further said that a short time ago he had been called by Mr. Bob Burwitz, Chief of the Cuban Desk in the State Department, and that Burwitz had told him not to fool around with SANCHEZ or Julio Dominguez because the man who had the support of the U.S. was AMBAL, and that as he, Burwitz, had knowledge of the great work done by GIRONA, he did not want him to continue losing more time.</p> <p>4. [redacted] added that GIRONA said that a few days later he received a phone call from AMBAL. GIRONA told AMBAL that he will help KUBB-1, because it was requested, but he would never have done so by his own wish.</p> <p>5. [redacted] said that GIRONA continued his travel on to Washington, where he resides at 1119 - 27th Street, N.W., Washington 7.</p>
