MPMORANDAM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Plans for the Establishment of a Provisional Government
REF: Paragraph 3, 20 March 1961 Mamo for the Record, Subject as Above

- 1. On 20 March 1961 at 1730 hours Mr. Runt telephonically advised Mr. Hapoli that Hiro Cardona had been unanimously elected Provisional President. The MRP, with Ray in attendance, voted in the election.
- 2. At 2315 hours 20 March informed the uniersigned telaphonically from Mi wi that Miro Cardona and some numbers of the Assembly vould proceed to He. York and that culd also fly to New York in order to be on hand. The undersigned informed along the lines of Bell 3004 (OUT 7728) attached.
- 3. On 21 Hardh Mr. Empoli was dispatched to New York after he had been briefed along the lines of Bell 3004 in order to assist ______in every possible way. By 1600 hours we had been informed that the following 19 Cubans, including Miro Cardons, were proceeding to New York: Miro, Pasce, Ray, Chibas, Artime, Varons, Carrillo, Alvarez Diaz, Vargus Gomes, Carbo, Fernandez Travicca, Ollada, Orlando Rodriguez, Hevia, Miguel Gomenles-interpreter who is coming at the request of Miro Berquin, Beruff. Bernie Barker is going along as general handy man.
- 4. In New York, as matters new stank, the Cubans will first meet in private in order to finalise their joint declaration and their program. The entire Assembly will then call a press conference at which time they will announce their unity in electing Kiro Cardons as the Chairman of the Revolutionary Council and in having agreed on a program. After this Miro will make his acceptance speech. In this connection it should be noted that it is hoped to have the publicity end handled by both Beichman, a member of the "Christian Science Komitor" staff and an acquaintance of Schlesinger, and Lem Jones.
- 5. At noon of March 21 the undersigned was in telephonic contact with Mr. Bradock of the State Department and the undersigned asked Mr. Bradock whether or not the Department of State was in agreement to the release—by the Cubans—of their platform, a resume of hich had been made eveilable to the Department of State (Mr. Berle) on 7 March. Mr. Bradock advised the undersigned at 1500 hours that the Department was in full agreement with the platform and had no objections to its release.

6. In the moon hours of 21 March the first press story (UPI) on the creation of the Revolutionary Council appeared on the vires (a copy is attached).
