1. During Alice B. Capenong's TVY at Headquarters the latter part of July 1965 she discussed the subject of this dispatch with Lowis W. Dollany. As Headquarters is aware, JHWAYE has two on-going programs for the benefit of the Brigade 2566 members who require special attention. These programs cover medical attention and vocational rehabilitation training. In the medical aspect of these programs there are three psychiatric cases who reprusent what could be persament financial responsibilities of EURAPA. (In addition to these two programs, affected Ray of Pigs Brigade members continue to receive monthly financial authort.) Under the medical program the Dade County Modical Association physicians dennted their services gratis to assist those Brigade members and the local bospitals gave us a reduced rute for their facilities. However, the psychiatrists did not nue fit to provide their services free of charge. Hence, costs for these individhals range from \$300 to \$860 per month for professional services, plus the monthly financial support provided each. Also, due to their mental state, they are unable to participate in the vocational rehabilitation program. From the reports of the psychiatrists, there esems to be no indication that we can expect an end to these treatments in the near future. 9/ Con history of subject sout Made at Brances &
