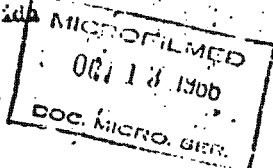

Dear Doctor Macco:

[redacted] a 33 year old Cuban male refugee was first seen in our clinic on October 14, 1965 with the history of having encephalitis at the age of 3, having seizures at the age of 12, being treated with medication, doing well until 1958 when he was beaten by the Batista police. From that time on he had 4 or 5 seizures a month, fought in the Bay of Pigs, escaped from Cuba, and was treated in the United States at Mercy Hospital.

His seizures continued and in 1964 removal of a focal epileptic focus from his Right Cerebral Hemisphere was done in Memphis. Since that time has been on Dilantin, Phenobarbital, and Mysoline, but took medications irregularly and had frequent seizures. Since that time he has been repeatedly seen in clinic, and we have tried to bring his seizures under control by getting him to take his medication regularly. At the present time we are still trying to regulate his medication. He has 2 to 3 seizures per month.
