MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: AMMUG/I Debriefing Report #200
 Personnel and Responsibilities

1. The DCI field station chief has no responsibility for physical or other security of the Cuban embassy or mission, nor does any member of his staff.

2. The DCI would not use a regular foreign service officer in the field because he has not been cleared and briefed and is not considered qualified, therefore, for intelligence tasks. If a foreign service officer is briefed, it may be assumed that he has been cleared and that he is thereafter considered a member of the DCI (at least by the DCI). On returning to Matamoros permanently, such a foreign service officer briefed for a field assignment normally would be sent to DCI headquarters rather than to the Ministry of Foreign Relations.

3. AMMUG/I knows of no cases in which FINEIRO or CHAIN performed a recruitment or exercised personal direction. He thought perhaps they showed personal interest in the Caso Asiatico because it was so large and important and the guerrilla groups in Guatemala were receiving the most assistance.

4. Among DCI personnel who have travelled to the Bloc are JIMENEZ, FINEIRO, "BENE", and Felipe BLAUDY. The purpose of such travel is not known.
