MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Ambassador Carrillo's Contact with
Venezuelan Returning from Moscow

1. The night of 1 February Antonio Maria Carrillo Carrera, Cuban Ambassador to France, missed a dinner engagement with ANWHIP-1. On 2 February Carrillo excused himself for not being able to keep the date explaining he was held up handling an emergency matter for a Venezuelan who arrived in Paris from Moscow. ANWHIP-1 got the impression Carrillo had to either pick up or deliver the Venezuelan to a railroad station and that part of the problem was that the Venezuelan's papers or documents were not in order. Carrillo also stated it was a sensitive matter as he had taken another person who was armed with him. ANWHIP-1 was requested to attempt to establish the identity of the Venezuelan and the purpose and reason for his travel.

2. This information was passed to the (Paris 15-4 Station) on 3 February.
