Reference is made to letter dated January 8, 1970, addressed to you from Congressman Donald G. Erotzman, Colorado, a copy of which is attached with its enclosure. The Congressman had asked for a reply by January 14, 1970.

On December 31, 1969, pursuant to the Congressman's inquiry, this Eureau advised Mr. Robert Tonsing, his administrative aide, that the FBI had conducted no investigation concerning the disappearance in March, 1969, of Twomas Riha, professor, University of Colorado, Boulder, Colorado, since there were no indications of a violation of federal law within its jurisdiction. This Bureau has no information concerning Riha's whereabouts and has conducted no investigation to locate him. On April 15, 1989, we did inquire of the Central Intelligence Agency if they had any interest in Riha. They did not.

In December, 1969, our Denver Office received a letter from Riha's mother requesting information concerning her son's disappearance. She was advised this was a natter not within the jurisdiction of the FBI. She was told, however, what if she so desired his name would be placed on the FBI's missing persons list. She replied on January 13, 1970, and aleclined to have his name placed on the list.

The Central Intelligence Agency advised this Eureau on January 13, 1970, that Congressman Brotzman upon inquiry of them had been advised that Agency was not investigating Riha 2 3 and not using him in any capacity. Central Intelligence Agency had suggested he check with the local police and the FBI but had suggested he check with the local police and the FBI but did not tell the Congressman the FBI was investigating subject.

A representative of the Bureau will personally contact Congressman Brotzman on January 14, 1970, and apprise him of the above facts.
