THE CUBAN EMBASSY ADMITTED THAT MARQUEZ AND GOMEZ HAD BEEN IN ERROR IN MEETING WITH THE NEWSMAN, BUT INSISTED THAT THEY HAD MADE NO COMMENTS WHICH COULD BE CONSTRUED AS BEING DETRIMENTAL TO THE VENEZUELAN GOVERNMENT OR CRITICAL OF VENEZUELAN HANDLING OF THE CUBANA CASE. HOWEVER, THE CUBANS WARNED THAT IT IS POSSIBLE THAT THE NEWSMAN MIGHT CLAIM THAT HE HAD DISCUSSED HIS INFORMATION WITH THE CUBAN EMBASSY IN CARACAS. THE EMBASSY, THEREFORE, WANTED IT CLEARLY UNDERSTOOD THAT CUBAN OFFICIALS HAD NOT PROVIDED THE NEWSMAN WITH ANY COMMENTS OR MATERIAL WHICH MIGHT APPEAR IN THE NEWSMAN'S FUTURE ARTICLES.
- 3. ON THE OTHER HAND, THE CUBANS CHARGED THAT THE FOREIGN NEWSMAN HAD THE BENEFIT OF A WIDE-RANGE OF INFORMATION ON CUBAN
