MEMORANDUM FOR Director of Central Intelligence

SUBJECT

Activities of Cuban-Trained Fernylan Guerrillas

- 1. The information contained in this memorandum supplements that sent to you on 14 May 1963. It was furnished recently by the same extremely sensitive source who underwent guerrilla training in Cuba and who has access to top leaders of the Movimiento de Esquierda Revolucionario (NIR).
- 2. The MIR continues its organizational planning for a revolution in Peru. At a meeting of the MIR in Lime, members discussed a plan to send an ultimatum to President-elect Fernando BELAUNDE Terry demanding that he set a date for the initiation of an agrarian reform program, as well as discussing other organizational matters. A second meeting was to be scheduled to discuss winning political backing for the MIR.
- In Chiclayo, a clandestine Committee of the Youth of Chiclayo and a clandestine Committee of Adults of Chiclayo have been organized with a full complement of officers for each committee. Manbers of the MIR are located in Orde and in the following Peruvian towns: Iquitos, Huancayo, Trujillo, Ayabaca, and Ayacucho. Funds are obtained from sources in Cuba, Algeria, China, and Rorea. The MIR plans to get eras from the Army, the police, and from Aristotle CHASSIS. Inte de la PHENTE Uceds, leader of the MIR who has his headquarters in Paris, expects to win support from specific Army personnel up to the rank of major. The party plans to buy cars and station sagons to move personnel and material when the revolution begins.
- L. Revolutionary action by the MIR is scheduled to begin in August. Hain targets include the American Embassy in Lina, the International Petroleum Company, the sirficials at Talara and Chicleyo, homes of Peruvian military leaders, and gasoline storage areas. With regard to the American Embassy, applicants for employment there (MIR members) would carry bosts in printcases or on their persons and deposit them in lavatories and waste baskets. Source believes this plan will work because it is not unusual for these applicants to get tired of waiting for appointments and leave, to return the next day.
- 5. The Partido Commiste Pervano (PCP) is planning to send young Perty members to Gusa for guerrilla training as part of its revolutionary progress. There is no cooperation now between the MIR and the PCP.

6. The Ejercito de Idberacion Nacional (EIN) has 20 members in the Cuzco area in southern Feru. The FIR does not intend to absorb them because Genzale FERNANDEZ Gasco; MIR leader in Lima; considers them nothing more than douboys. When a member of the guerrilla group led by Hugo BLANDO, Fidelista leader recently captured by the police, asked that the MIR let them join, FERNANDEZ refused on the grounds that Blanco's group was penetrated by the police and frotskylsts.
