Interview:

On 2/24/78, SCA Investigators Harold Leap and Robert Buras interviewed former FBI agent Milton R. Kaach at his residence, 7321 Sycamore, New Orleans, La., relative to the Security investigation of LHO prior to the assassination of JFK and the investigative response by the N.O. field office after the assassination.

Kaach began his FBI employment in 1941 and retired in 1964. The last 13 years of his career was in the New Orleans office.

Kaach advised that he was assigned the LHO Security investigation when LHO returned to New Orleans. Kaach, did not interview LHO or conduct surveillance relative to LHO's activity. Kaach said he had no knowledge of any agent in the N.O. office, other than Quiggle, contacting or conducting surveillance relative to LHO activities. Kaach said he did contact LHO's landlady on two occasions. time was to ask that she report to him any unusual activity She never reported any information to Kaach.

On Kaach's second visit the landlady informed him that LHO had moved to Dallas. Kaach said that he then transferred the security case to the Dallas field office.

Leap ask Kaach if he was censored by the FBI for the manner in which he handled the LHO security investigation. Kaach said he was not censored. Kaach said he retired rather than be transferred to Springfield and the transfer was not related to the LHO investigation.

Kaach said that he was certain the LHO was not a security informant for the N.O. office. As S/A assigned the LHO security investigation, he would have been advised if LHO was an informant.
