The only info developed to date pointing to the defunct status of each of the aforementioned companies comes from FRED E. ANDERSON, a PCI of CGO, and OSCAR SCHULTZ, described as former director of United Dryer, who was very reluctant to furnish any worthwhile or first-hand info when interviewed in CG during February, 1958. As a matter of info, it has been previously reported that National Filben liquidated in 1951 with losses said to be around \$400,000. The present status of each of the above mentioned companies and the MANNARINO brothers alleged interest and control thereof must be clearly established, bearing in mind the possibility that directors and officers identified in rereps may have fronted for the MANNARINO brothers.

During interviews with officers and/or directors, consideration should be given to making a specific inquiry as to whether the interviewee fronted for the MANNARINO brothers.

CG is also asked to place a stop with the source at the Bismarck Hotel, to insure prompt notification of any future visits to CG on the part of SAMUEL MANNARINO and F. W. ZOGG.

During regular contacts with PCI FRED ANDERSON, he should be interviewed re his knowledge of the MANNARINO brothers and results of such contacts should be furnished to PGO.

As a matter of info re lead to identify A. GOODMAN, in reCGrep, Miami note that GOODMAN, aka., ABE GOODMAN, was formerly married to ELLA MAE RIEBLE, wa., ELLA MAE GOODMAN, FBI #338335A, a former PCI of PGO, now serving an 18 months sentence in the Federal Reformatory for Women, Alderson, W.Va., for violation of the WSTA.

In interview with Buagents, May, 1956, ELLA MAE GOODMAN stated in 1953, ABE GOODMAN was driving a cab in Miami, Fla., and in October, 1955, was living in Havana, Cuba, where he claimed he had a part interest in the Sans Souci Gambling Casino. GOODMAN added that she last saw ABE around February, 1956, when he was in Pittsburgh for the purpose of delivering a large sum of money to GABRIEL MANNARINO, supposedly
