On 3/15/62, PCI HOWARD D. BAUTSCH, advised that he had no additional information re the NOLA Printing Company, moving to 2813 Jefferson Highway. He stated that he had not been approached for race results from Jefferson Downs, and if the services were offered, he would not be interested.

Mr. CHANLER JOSEY, Special Agent, Southern Bell Telephone Company, furnished the information from the Southern Bell Telephone Company records.

On 5/7/62, Special Agent JOSEPH BRANDT, U. S. Internal Revenue Service, Intelligence Division, advised that there was no additional activity regarding the tax suit against the NOLA Printing Company. He advised that they had paid the tax bill.
