On July 10, 1948, SF 1357 made available to San Francisco communications in the Russian language which were found to be letters [from K. Efremov, Consul General of USSR, San Francisco, to "Head 45 of the Consulate Administration MID of USSR, Com. Belyaev." Attachment to letter (1) was a list of persons who had applied for USSR citizenship and concerning whom no decision had been received from the L \$2(4) Presidium of the Supreme Soviet of the USSR. Dates on which applications had been forwarded to the USSR were shown. Attachment to lette (2) was a list of persons who had applied for visas to enter the Soviet Union and concerning whom no decision had been received. Dates on which applications were forwarded were shown (65-35149-419)

Complete lists of names appearing in (1) and (2) above, have been furnished to Criminal Division, copies to INS, and to State Department, by letters dated October 6, 1951, it being stated identifying data, if found in Bureau files, will be furmished by individual communications.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Supervisor to whom captioned case is assigned review files and furnish pertinent information by memoranda to the Criminal Division, copies to INS, and to State Department. If data has previously been furnished, the agencies named should be advised concerning the communications previously forwarded to them. Reference should be made to Bureau letter to the agency dated October 6, 1951, captioned "Applications for Citizenship in USSR; Applications for Visas to Enter the USSR, al Security - R." The individual memoranda should be captioned the remaining or names of the individuals involved and should be designated for individual case files, if such exist. 🞨
