ADMINISTRATIVE

As the Bureau was advised by reairtel, this report has been delayed in order to obtain the results of the trial in U. S. District Court, Pittsburgh, of subject, his brother, and their associates on charges of income tax fraud and evasion, plus conspiracy.

During the period of this report, liaison has been closely maintained with Intelligence Division, Internal Revenue Service, Pittsburgh, which has an investigation underway regarding this subject.

By radiogram, 11/19/63, Pittsburgh advised the Bureau that on 11/18/63 PCI ANTHONY JOHN WISE, JR., advised SA THOMAS G. FORSYTH, III, as follows:

On that date at about 4:30 P.M., SAM MANNARINO stated "they" intended to try to get to Mrs. BROWN, wife of Allegheny County Judge HOMER S. BROWN, who had been selected to the jury in U. S. District Court, Pittsburgh, that day. MANNARINO said the BROWNs had a daughter who was going with the son of PAUL LONG, Pittsburgh Radio and Television News Commentator, and the approach would be made through PAUL LONG. When asked how he knew LONG would go for the deal, MANNARINO laughingly said he was positive LONG would go for it.

It is noted that Judge BROWN and his wife, Mrs. WILHELMINA B. BROWN, are of the Negro race, and the PAUL LONG family is Caucasian.

The above information was furnished to U. S. Attorney GUSTAVE DIAMOND, Pittsburgh, who was scheduled to commence presentation of the Government case against subjects on November 19, 1963, on charges of income tax evasion. USA DIAMOND requested that no active investigation be made to prove or disprove the above allegation at that time for

fear of jeopardizing the case, but he suggested that contact be maintained with the Pittsburgh Office source (PCI WISE) in an effort to ascertain whether or not attempts to contact Mrs. BROWN had been made and if they had been successful.

On 11/21/63, PCI WISE advised SA FORSYTH as follows:

On 11/20/63, SAM MANNARINO stated that the "contact" had been made with "Judge BROWN's wife." MANNARINO did not indicate that the results of the contact had been successful from his point of view and, in fact, appeared to be deeply worried about the outcome of the trial. MANNARINO changed one part of his story in that he now referred to Judge BROWN's son going with the daughter of PAUL LONG, rather than BROWN's daughter going with LONG's son, as had been previously stated.

The above information was furnished to USA GUSTAVE DIAMOND, Pittsburgh, on 11/21/63.

No further information regarding the above allegations was furnished by PCI or any other source.

The trial of the MANNARINOs in USDC, Pittsburgh, on income tax fraud and evasion charges, is estimated by USA DIAMOND to be about half over and may be concluded by 11/29/63. Although a report is slightly past due in each of the MANNARINO cases, Pittsburgh will, in the interest of continuity, delay the reports until the conclusion of the trial UACB.

ON NOVEMBER 18 LAST, PCI ANTHONY JOHN WISE, JR., ADVISED SA THOMAS G. FORSYTH, 111, AS FOLLOWS: ON THAT DATE AT ABOUT 4:30 PM, SAM MANNARING STATED THEY INTENDED TO TRY TO GET TO MRS BROWN, WIFE OF ALLEGHENY COUNTY JUDGE HOMER S. BROWN, WHO HAD BEEN SELECTED TO THE JURY IN USDC, PITTSBURGH, THAT DAY. MANNARING SAID THE BROWNS HAD A DAUGHTER WHO IS GOING WITH THE SON OF PAUL LONG, PITTSBURGH RADIO AND TELEVISION NEWS COMMENTATOR, AND THE APPROACH WOULD BE MADE THROUGH PAUL LONG. WHEN ASKED HOW HE KNEW LONG WOULD GO FOR THE DEAL, MANNARING LAUGHINGLY SAID HE WAS POSITIVE, LONG WOULD GO FOR IT. IT IS NOTED THAT JUDGE BROWN AND HIS WIFE, MRS. WILLHELMINA B. BROWN, ARE OF THE NEGRO RACE AND THE PAUL LONG FAMILY IS CAUCASIAN. THE ABOVE INFORMATION HAS BEEN FURNISHED TO USA GUSTAVE DIAMOND, PITTSBURGH, WHO WILL COMMENCE PRESENTATION OF THE GOVERNMENT CASE AGAINST SUBJECT ON NOVEMBER 19 INSTANT, ON CHARGES OF INCOME TAX EVASION.
