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occur in the various military intelligence headquarters organizations of the military departments here in Washington, D. C. The principal administrative and procedural changes attendant to the establishment of the DIA will be reflected in the development of over-all DoD plans, programs, and procedures for intelligence activities.

In the course of the preliminary studies and research which led to the establishment of DIA, certain areas of intelligence activity were identified as being subjects requiring special analysis either because of their close relationship to non-intelligence DoD activities or because of their having been identified as being areas of intelligence activity in which the role of DIA had to be very carefully delineated.

These were:

- (1) Mapping and charting.
- (2) Counterintelligence and clandestine operations.
- (3) Attaches and [MAAG's.] [I]
- (4) Specialized or joint intelligence training.
- (5) Technical intelligence.
