I think that the best way to search the HSCA database right now is just by scrolling down the agency file numbers. Not that every one is there mind you. In the open documents and in the closed documents, it is useful to search using the agency file number as well as some word from the RIF, and often you can get a direct hit. As I wrote before I have asked Chet to index the HSCA database, and I think it would be useful to wait and see if that is helpful before we get into any big data entry project. We have another category of documents that have been referred and returned and open but are in the database as postponed. I guess there might be a way to update it wholesale when the database is updated, but I don't know if that involves document by document data entry or not. I faxed five RIFs out to College Park to compare with ours, and they did not give us any new information. They were documents from the binders that were not in the HSCA database, but were in the Open documents database. On ST's database they are "open in full".
