Subject: KGB research

As I mentioned on your voice mail, the MLK Public Library was closed for furlough today. At the LoC, I skimmed the following three books: Inside the KGB: My Life in Soviet Intelligence, Vladimir Kuzichken, 1994 Hostile Action, Peter Shipley, 1990 The KGB in Kremlin Politics, Jeremy Azrael, 1989 None of these books offered any clues as to where records might be located. Azrael writes a history of internal KGB politics, i.e., who it backed in internal power struggles, etc.; Shipley details interaction between the KGB and MI-5, but gets into more history than detail; Kuzichken was a KGB officer in Tehran from 1977-1982 and details his perspective on the American hostage crisis and on Afghanistan. In addition, I tried to request the Kalugin book; it is currently not on shelf. Another book that we may wish to check out has not yet arrived in the LoC, but may be available elsewhere. It is Memoirs of a Spymaster: My 50 Years in the KGB, by Vitaly Pavlov, Carroll and Graf, 1994. There are approximately 50 other books in the subject file KOMITET G(whatever) BEZAPASNOSTI at the Library of Congress. At your direction, I can return there and continue checking material in that file for anything that would help us. I hadn't the time to check them today.
