of this year and Archives has yet to hear back from the Department on it. The letter does not appear to contain any sensitive information and may have been referred to the NYPD simply as a function of the Department's status as the document's originator. The NYPD's 6/9/78 letter was a response to an HSCA/Blakey letter of 5/17/78, wherein Blakey forwarded a list of 97 names in which the HSCA might have an interest. In its 6/9/78 reply, Kenneth Conboy (Deputy Commissioner for Legal Matters) indicates that the NYPD has files on 50 of the 97 individuals Blakey listed. A list of these 50 names (OC figures) is attached to the letter. Conboy's letter also references that, previously, the Department had turned over, pursuant to an HSCA subpoena, "all information on file regarding Morris Shenker and Carlos Marcello." This turnover took place, according to this letter, on 12/2/77, and the HSCA staffer involved in the turnover was a Richard Wrase (a name, I am chagrined to admit, which is not on the list of HSCA staffers I compiled for you). Conboy also indicates that the Department cannot tell Blakey whether or not any individuals on Blakey's list were subjects of electronic surveillance, as such information is legally sealed. Conboy suggests Blakey contact the District Attorney if he wishes to pursue that particular question further.FYI, I have also attached to a hardcopy version of this memo a copy of a sample NARA letter to a local law enforcement agency (this one happens to be to the Ft. Lauderdale, FL, Police Dept.) regarding referrals. I've highlighted the procedure the local agency is requested to follow. NARA hasn't heard anything back from NYPD, not even a letter of acknowledgment of receipt of the
