	entry:Subject: Private Records Donated to JFK CollectionSummary of the Call:I called the FOIA hotline today to
	talk to a FOIA counselor about how the Review Board should deal with FOIA requests for records that we
	receive from private individuals who are donating records to the JFK Collection. The FOIA requires Federal
	agencies to make "agency records" available to the public, pursuant to its provisions. "Agency records" are
	those records that an agency possesses and controls. I explained to Ms. Montada that, under the JFK Act,
	private individuals can donate materials to the JFK Collection, but that the Review Board might be in the
	position of acting as conduit between the donor and NARA. Thus, although the Review Board may possess
	such materials at any given time, it never controls the records. Ms. Montada agreed that the Review Board
	need not process such materials under the FOIA. When we receive requests for donated materials that we
	possess, she suggested that we write to the requester and explain that the records are not agency records
