I've attached the hard-copy of this E-Mail to the above-referenced document. I didn't include it in my broader Connally medical history memo because I found no other corroborating documentation. The only other reference I've seen to the issues raised in 000829 is in Executive Session discussions the HSCA members and staff held in the period just after Stokes became Chairmen and the Committee was fighting for its existence (while Sprague was still Chief Counsel). The lead was cited at that time, by Bob Tanenbaum, as one that could be used with the House leadership as an argument for extending the Committee's life. Since I've found nothing else on this in my database search for Connally medical records (nor do searches for David Stewart or Dent Morriss yield anything), I am inclined to think the lead was eventually pursued and found to be without value. With your greater command of the literature, this may be old news to you. But I thought I'd pass it along.
