The author, an assistant pro- fessor in the University of Pittsburgh system, sets the record straight about JFK's social and economic policies, and corrects (or counters) many of the false images of JFK projected by historians who have not done their homework over the years. In the course of doing so, the author identifies the many enemies JFK had in the financial establishment, and highlights the virulent press attacks against the President while in office, which he believes led to the false and inaccurate portrayal of JFK by many historians as either shallow and without many ideas, or as a fiscal conservative who was a tool of the monied establishment. The author makes a strong case that JFK was an innovative social-and-fiscal progressive who attempted to make many changes to the fiscal, tax and investment environment in America, and in doing so, made many enemies.)
