This is just to close the loop and pass the baton over to you...I was in the SCIF most of the day today, with the secure FAX phone on "mute" so I didn't have to listen to the thing ring all day. On two occasions, once in the morning, and once in the afternoon, I "un-muted" the ringer switch. On each occasion, it rang (with no one at the other end), just as it did last week, and would have continued, if I had not muted it again. In between the spurious rings, during the afternoon test, a human being answered when I picked up the phone (during one of the rings only), and he asked if this was still the Federal Trade Commission, and I said no. I don't know if this is related to all the other calls or not, but he said he had a book which listed our secure FAX number as the FTC. I'm passing this matter off to you now, per your request. As a practical matter, the occupants of the SCIF can avoid the considerable annoyance by hitting the "mute ringer" button; trouble is, that makes it problematic for a bonafide caller to get through on that line.
