Dadu	This morning I did a spot-check of several randomly selected RIFs for "trunk" documents that showed "branch" duplicates in the cross-reference field, where the RIFs for the "branch" duplicates in our FBI databases did not show a "see" reference to the duplicate "trunk" document in the subject field. (Instead, the subject field on the "branch" RIFs is blank.) In each case, the cross-referenced "branch" document WAS a duplicate of the corresponding "trunk" document. However, I am still very concerned about the blank subject fields in these "branch" RIFs. As I understand it, these RIFs must have contained "see" references in the subject field when we got them from the FBI otherwise, they would not have been picked up when we created the cross-reference field in the duplicate "trunk" documents. It would still be useful to have the "see" references on the "branches." Additionally, if "see" references have been stripped from the subject fields of numerous RIFs, I fear that other types of "subjects" may have been stripped from subject fields on FBI RIFs, which would, at least, render suspect the results of subject-matter searches in the FBI document databases.Please give this problem promet attention.
