He made some VERY STRONG suggestions which I assured him I would pass on to you: Namely, that the matrices you are developing in "word" are very cumbersome, and limiting in terms of how much you can write down. He suggested that this kind of information be put in "Notes", because then you can make an unlimited number of entries (not a maximum of 50), and more important, you can place an unlimited amount of text next to each entry (I think via the "expand" mode)...literally pages, for example, in the "information" or "notes" columns you are using. He said that you would have to get with Chet (and him) to develop the kind of matrix you want in Notes...and said the earlier you start the better, because then, the less you will have to transfer when you transition from what you have already done to the new system.
