The following is a summary of my activities over the last two weeks. Undertook and carried out a research project for Jeremy at the Library of Congress. I was instructed to search the databases for any mentions of Win Scott, Thomas C. Mann, Walter Sheridan or Marty Underwood. I found that no books in the L of C databases were written either by or specifically about any of these men.
