(AP) \_ All 4,040 midshipmen at the U.S. NavalAcademy were given urine tests for drug use after two students werecaught with LSD. The two midshipmen, who have not been identified, were confinedto the grounds Sunday. They could be court-martialed or, morelikely, expelled. As part of the investigation, the other midshipmen underwenturinalysis on Sunday and Monday. The results are due in severalweeks. The academy already randomly tests about 240 midshipmen eachweek and also tests about 2,000 at a time twice a year, when theyreturn from leave. That testing led to the expulsion of two midshipmen for drugpossession earlier this year. ``This is part of the Navy's zero tolerance toward drug abuse,"academy spokesman Lt. Scott Allen said. ``We hope this is just asmall incident. We don't think it's a widespread problem."
