But it's clear that not every article from an issue is in the folder you can tell because the pages are numbered and there are page gaps between otherwise consecutive (in the folders) articles.In searching for the articles I had to move outside the warm and friendly domain of Steve Tilley and into the unfamiliar (and less hospitable) territory of the Textual Reference Branch. In ordering the "issues" of Studies, I had to put in a pull slip and wait my turn in the public Research Room for the requested issues to arrive. I was not able to reconnect with my contact in the Textual Reference Branch to ask him to confirm/explain why some of the articles were clearly and purposefully missing from the issues.
