The best way to keep abreast of declassifications in CIA records in the JFK collection is to watch for the notices in the Federal Register, which lists by document number the decisions that the ARRB Board has made and the releases that will shortly occur. Such notifications and subsequent releases occur approximately once every month. Also watch for the new releases at NARA II, in College Park. The ARRB Board will eventually consider every CIA document in the JFK collection in which CIA originally took redactions when it retired these records to NARA. As for the document that you requested CIA to release under the Freedom of Information Act, this is indeed an an Army Intelligence report. If in the JFK collection it will be reviewed by the Board for possible release along with the rest of the collection.
