As mentioned, there were handwritten staffer notes in one of the Pike Committee files which referenced the above interview. The notes indicated the interview was conducted by the Baltimore FBI office. The Special-Agent-in-Charge was a Thomas Farrow. The interview seems to have concerned any information Hunt might have had relative to the assassination attempt (in 1972, if I recall correctly) on Gov. George Wallace. If I extrapolated from the notes correctly, there was an allegation that G. Gordon Liddy was in the crowd when Wallace was shot, and Chuck Colson at the White House asked Hunt to check into it. There was no direct indication that this particular interview had anything to do with the assassination of President Kennedy, but in the same batch of notes there were references to attempts to tie down Hunt's whereabouts on 11/22/63. For what it's worth.
