I throw out the following in the hope that someone already knows the answer. If not, Mary/Jeremy will have to address a question to Barry.As anyone who has looked at them knows, the folders in the Security Classified Files are numbered in ascending order, but not sequentially -- there are gaps in the numbered folders. The explanation for this, according to the NARA summary for this record series, is as follows: "Many of the numbered documents missing from this series were returned to the CIA in accordance with the access agreement made with that agency. According to the CIA History Office, approximately 9 feet of records, numbered 01-JFK through 191-JFK (with gaps), are in that agency's possession."The obvious question is whether these HSCA/CIA records are already being processed (mixed in with the Segregated Collection?) or whether we need to ask the agency about their status and whereabouts.PS - Thanks to Michelle for asking her question about the non-sequential folders which led me to check with Kris, which led to me asking this question. Neither Kris nor Steve Tilley can shed any light on the current status of the CIA records once contained in the subsequently removed folders.
