I am not aware of any previous statements from Dr. McClelland that need clarification, except perhaps for his original opinion that the President was shot in the left temple, but I believe he has retracted that statement. Serving him with a subpoena and forcing him to give the same information he has given over the years would be, in my opinion, a waste of time.Furthermore, there is no evidence that I have seen that indicates Dr. McClelland (or any other Parkland doctor) has any medical records not already in the JFK Collection.
