I've talked to Jeremy since I began this E-Mail, so this is largely redundant for him but of perhaps some minimal value for the cc'd folks: Nina cleared for release approximately 20 DOS documents today during her 2 hour stay. She's coming back tomorrow to look at some documents she didn't get to, as well as re-review some documents she set aside for further study today. She'll probably be here around 3:00 PM tomorrow. In addition to the approx. 20 she stamped as releasable, there are two she's willing to release but which have CIA equities. Perhaps we can show these to [Screened by: NARA RD-F on October 12, 2016 according to the John F. Kennedy Records Collection Act of 1992, 44 U.S.C. 2107, Section 6(1)A], et al, if they come back next week as Barry indicated they would? Mine and Jeremy's shared understanding (after some struggle) of how these Nina-stamped documents will be handled is that, while they will not be voted on by the Board, we will reference them in our federal register notice, using language we devised for the CIA-cleared Security Classified Testimony documents a month or so ago.
