RecordsSummary of the Call:1:34 p.m. - Asysre, an AP reporter in the New Orleans Bureau, called and told me
the following:Judge Marullo found reporter Richard Angelico in contempt today. He sentenced Angelico to a
three month suspended sentence and fined him \$100.Asyre also said that Marullo asked First Assistant District
Attorney Camille Buras to prepare an order, to be signed by Marullo and sent to the ARRB, to send the grand
jury records back "after they finish with them." The reporter did not know what the judge meant by this
phrase "after they finish with them."The reporter wanted a comment on the judge asking the prosecutor to
prepare the order for the ARRB. I responded in the following manner:First, I will not comment specifically on
Marullo and the order because we have obviously not yet heard of this or seen anything connected with
it.Second, in general, I will note that the Board operates under a federal law which states that it supersedes
other law.Third, our interpretation of the law is that these records are clearly defined as assassination records.
