He has agreed to meet with us at 10:00 Thursday morning. I will meet him in the lobby and bring him up. He was stationed at Bethesda from 1972-1980 and photographed autopsies all the time. He doesn't believe the morgue used in the JFK autopsy was torn down until after he transferred in 1980. He returned to Bethesda in 1986, and from 1986-1989 he was the senior instructor in medical photography at Bethesda. Following the end of this tour in 1989, he says he retired from the Navy. While he was senior instructor, he says that there was never more than a maximum of 46 people in the Navy who did medical photography. He confirmed that he knew John Stringer. This should be a very interesting and useful interview.
