For page two -- here are several sections of the JFK Act that also discuss transmission to the Archivist. Feel free to pick and choose the sections that you would like to include. Section 2(b) of the JFK Act states that its purposes are "to require the expeditious public transmission to the Archivist and public disclosure of [assassination] records. "Section 4(a)(1) of the JFK Act states that the JFK Collection shall consist of, inter alia, "all Government records relating to the assassination . . . which shall be transmitted to the National Archives in accordance with section 2107 of title 44, United States Code . . . . "Section 4(a)(2) of the JFK Act states that "[t]he Collection shall include -- (A) all assassination records -- (ii) that are required to be transmitted to the National Archives. "Section 7(j)(1)(B) of the JFK Act empowers the Review Board to "direct Government offices to transmit to the Archivist assassination records as required under this Act . . . . "Section 9(c)(1) of the JFK Act requires that "[t]he Review Board shall direct that all assassination records be transmitted to the Archivist and disclosed to the public in the Collection in the absence of clear and convincing evidence that -- (A) a Government record is not an assassination record; or (B) a Government record or
