Harold A. Rydberg, USNNeither an SSN nor a military service number is available for Mr. Rydberg. Here is what we have on him: On March 13, 1978 he was sent the standard letter from the Navy (Bureau of Medicine and Surgery) which read: "In November 1963, you were ordered to discuss with no one the events connected with...", and the letter went on to rescind the order, saying that it was O.K. for him to talk to the HSCA. Taken on its face value, the letter indicates that Rydberg was probably at the autopsy, because of its wording, "...in November 1963." The file of original "orders of silence" which the Navy (BMS) forwarded to the HSCA in September, 1977 does not include a letter to Rydberg, but that file (which supposedly contains 16 letters but actually forwards only 15) is missing one letter, so the matter remains unresolved. We do know that Mr. Rydberg made the 3 medical illustrations used by the Warren Commission between March 12-16, 1964. There is a possibility that his "letter of silence" might have been based on his medical illustration work from March 1964, and that the letter rescinding the oath incorrectly cited "November 1963" simply because it was a form letter used for all 16 people; therefore, we can not conclusively state that he was at the autopsy. Sorry, but because I do not have his original letter of silence, I cannot give you his military service number. Dave, please try to locate his present whereabouts now--address and phone number. Dr. Humes told us that he had abandoned his career as a medical illustrator, and was now an emergency medical technician (EMT).
