I see no reason not to allow the Secret Service to pick up the copies of USSS assassination records recently designated by the Board. It strikes me as an efficient way to handle the problem and will ensure that the Secret Service processes precisely what the Board has designated. We know what we have designated and should be able to track what the Secret Service does. They would only need to mark their redactions on these copies with see-through highlighter and return them to the Board. Those containing no redaction can be sent directly to the Archives. I know that Joan has very strong feelings about this and has invested considerable time in preparing the way for an outcome that did not envision us returning the copies. We need, however, to be convinced that our actions contribute to the most efficient processing of the records and are not simply punitive. What do you think?
